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General Information For All Tours

1. Bookings & Payment

Bookings can be made by completing the booking form on this brochure or by contacting us by phone, mail or e-mail. Bookings can be made with a \$100 per person deposit. Full fare is payable one month prior to departure or two months if the tour contains an airfare. Bookings within the full fare payable period require full payment.

We accept payments by cash, bank cheque, personal cheque, money order, bank transfer or credit card (Visa, MasterCard). Payments by credit card over \$200 are not accepted unless a 2% of value service fee is included.

2. Departure Points

- Land based tours depart from and return to the Westrail Centre (Interstate Rail Terminal) East Perth.
- Tours with air travel depart from Perth Airport.
- Passengers may also depart from Casey Australia Tours O'Connor depot by arrangement.

3. Fare Protection

For extended tours a Fare Protection Plan is available which is designed to protect your fare should you become ill or a member of your family become life threateningly ill before or whilst on tour. Details are available when booking.

4. Your Health

We have no age limit or health standard. We do however trust to your good sense. We ask that if you do have a condition which may affect you while on tour to inform our staff on booking. We suggest, if you are elderly or have recently had a serious illness, to consult your doctor to see if you are fit to travel. Because of the variety of temperatures encountered on the tours and the fact that you travel in close confinement with other people you may consider having a flu injection before departure, particularly on winter tours.

5. Coaches

Casey Australia Tours, operate;

With onboard toilet, reclining seats, air conditioning, tinted windows, comfortable air suspension & chilled drink fountain.

4WD Coaches

With reclining seats, seatbelts, air conditioning, tinted windows & front mounted touring camera. No onboard toilet.

6. Pricing

First price shown for a Perth departure with a return to Perth. All prices are based on twin share accommodation. Single Supplements are available on most tours. All inclusions are stated at the beginning of each tour description and in the day by day itinerary.

7. Airfares

We use air services of Qantas, Virgin Blue, Jetstar, Skywest and Air New Zealand. Carrier and flight times are provided one month prior to departure.

8. Alteration of Flights

If you wish to have a different departure or return flight from the scheduled flight a fee of \$50 per person is payable along with any increase in the cost of the new flight from the scheduled flight.

9. Departures from other capital cities (Not Perth)

For most tours there is a set price for passengers departing from other capital cities. This price includes the tour as per the day by day description as well as anything noted below the price.

Types of Accommodation

On the day by day descriptions in this brochure you will find codes relating to meal and accommodation, these codes are explained below.

Motels

Generally 3 star or better. All rooms are ensuited. Most will have TV, Air Cond, Tea and Coffee Facilities. Rooms will be allocated on a twin share basis. Optional Single Supplement available, please see individual tour details for costing.



Cabins

In remote areas the only accommodation available is sometimes basic.

Cabins may be a single room with ensuite, TV etc and the equivalent of a budget motel, others may be a room with beds and no ensuite. Cabins at Mount Augustus, Mungeranie & Ray Station are mining style 'dongas' and do not provide ensuite.

Cabins in Coober Pedy

Cabins are underground dormitory style and do not provide ensuite.



Camping

Some camping is in the beauty of Australian bush and on other nights we use the facilities of caravan parks, national parks or stations. Passengers are asked to assist in teams to erect the campsite.

Tents will be allocated on a twin share basis. Tents are 180cm high 270cm square at the base, fully floored, and very simple to erect,

four pegs a pole in the middle and the tent is up. Inside the tent sleeping is on camp stretchers. It is recommended passengers bring a warm bottom sheet and sleeping bag or warm rug to sleep in.

There is electric floodlighting of the area until after dinner is finished and packed away, we then enjoy the peace of the night bush. A torch is recommended.



Meal Codes and Descriptions

Breakfast

CAB - Camp Breakfast; Cereal, toast, tea & coffee.

BB - Breakfast Boxes; Each room is given a box with all the requirements for cereal and toast.

CB - Continental Breakfast; Provided at motel or at attraction.

FB - Fully Cooked Breakfast; Provided by motel or attraction.

Lunch

PL- Picnic Lunch; Meat, salads, tea & coffee. Could also be Sausage sizzle or hot dogs.

Dinner

CAD- Camp Dinner; Supplied by Casey Tours staff, Usually includes, soup, bbq, vegetables, desert.

PD- Picnic Dinner; Examples include Fish & Chips on Cable Beach or a Sausage sizzle at Uluru.

RD- Restaurant Dinner; Provided at a club, bistro or other establishment.

MD - Motel Dinner; Two or three course evening meal. Provided at the motel.

Notes

Breakfast on the first day and dinner on the last day of all tours is not included.

Generally lunches are not included.

All meals on planes are not included (some will be offered).

the Tuna and Aquaculture Industries with expert local commentary. After lunch we head up the East Coast of the Eyre Peninsula via Cowell to Whyalla, which was founded as Hummock's Hill in 1901 by the Broken Hill Proprietary Company (BHP) as the end of a tramway bringing iron ore from the Middleback Ranges. Tonight we reach Port Augusta, the most northerly port in South Australia. Note: Boat cruise included.

Day 7: (CB, RD, Motel) We travel up into the North Mount Lofty Ranges via Orroroo and Peterborough to Burra. After lunch a guided town tour of this great heritage copper mining town. The whole town is classified by the National Trust, giving a great insight into the hard lives that the early settlers endured in Australia. Later onto our accommodation in Elizabeth.

Day 8: (CB, Motel) Our tour of Adelaide, founded in 1836 and planned by Colonel William Light starts with Port Adelaide then the City Centre. We have free time in the city followed by an optional tram ride to Glenelg with a free evening at this lovely seaside community. Return to our accommodation at Elizabeth.

Day 9: (CB, MD, Motel) We spend the morning in the Adelaide Hills and Hahndorf a quaint town reflecting its colourful German Heritage, before heading south to the Fleurieu Peninsula and Victor Harbour. In the afternoon there is the optional visit to the South Australian Whale Centre or a Horse Drawn Tram out to Granite Island just off the coast. Note: Whale Centre and Horse Drawn Tram not included.

Day 10: (CB, MD, Motel) We start early and head to Cape Jarvis to board the ferry to Kangaroo Island. We reach the Island at the port of Penneshaw and drive to Emu Ridge Eucalyptus Distillery before visiting the largest town on the island Kingscote. In the afternoon we visit a Sea Lion colony on the south side of the island before returning to the mainland. Note: Ferry and Eucalyptus Distillery included.

Day 11: (CB, RD, Motel) A morning visit to Goolwa at the mouth of the Murray / Darling River Basin, then onto Murray Bridge for lunch. In the evening we board the Murray Expedition for a three day cruise up the Murray River. Having settled into your comfortable accommodation, enjoy drinks before a delicious buffet supper, as the Murray Expedition cruises to her overnight mooring point and your Captain introduces his crew. Later, the Murray Expedition moors amid



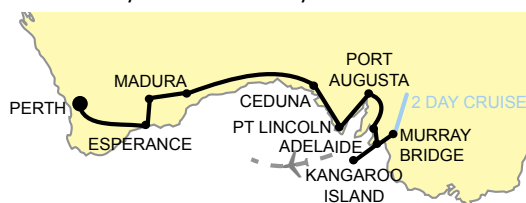

the peace and tranquillity of Sunnyside.

Day 12: (FB, PL, RD, Motel) Breakfast heartily whilst cruising. The Murray Expedition continues upstream today through some of the most spectacular scenery on the entire River Murray system. Cruising continues past the many small river townships, with the chance to absorb the unique surroundings with a late morning stopover in the historic town of Mannum. Enjoy a delicious lunch prepared by the Murray Expedition chefs as you cruise before a late afternoon arrival at Teal Flat. A highlight of your journey is a guided cruise led by an ecologist aboard a small boat through the lagoons and inlets of this sanctuary. This evening there is a traditional Australian barbecue on shore followed by live Aussie Bush entertainment around a blazing campfire (subject to fire restrictions).

Day 13: (CB, PL, RD, Motel) Enjoy breakfast as the Murray Expedition cruises downstream, before a mid morning arrival in picturesque Mannum. Here board the waiting coach for a tour to the Reedy Creek Environmental Park. Your guide will provide you with information to enable you to identify significant rock formations and the abundant native vegetation and birdlife. Lunch is a superb buffet with fresh local produce including cold meats, seafood and salads as the Murray Expedition cruises downstream. This afternoon there will be more spectacular scenery before disembarking in Murray Bridge.

Day 14: (CB) Through the Adelaide Hills to the picturesque town of Birdwood, visiting the National Car Museum (optional), the premier car museum in Australia. This is not just a museum for car enthusiasts, it contains many unique vehicles of great historical importance. From Birdwood we continue through the beautiful Barossa Valley to the picturesque towns of Angaston and Nuriootpa, before returning to Adelaide for our flight home. Note: Entry into Car Museum not included.



Day 1: (MD, Motel) To Wagin to visit the Wagin Historical Village, a step back in time that replicates the development of a typical rural Australian community over the last two hundred years. After lunch we travel through Lake Grace and Lake King to Esperance. Note: Wagin Village included.

Day 2: (CB, MD, Motel) A full day in Esperance commences with a marvellous boat cruise in the harbour and nearby islands. After lunch free time to explore Esperance. We take a delightful trip along the coast, Twilight Drive and return to Esperance via Pink Lake. Note: Boat Cruise included.

Day 3: (CB, MD, Motel) North through Salmon Gums to Norseman for Morning Tea. Onto the Eyre Highway, named after E J Eyre, the first European to travel across the southern stretch of the country in 1840. We spend the night out on the Nullarbor.

Day 4: (CB, MD, Motel) Crossing into South Australia the Eyre Highway sits very close to the cliffs of the Great Australian Bight, we visit one of the spectacular cliffs of the Bight and travel through the Nullarbor National Park. The Trans Australian Railway runs parallel over 100 km to the north. During the middle of the day we visit Nullarbor Roadhouse and travel the Treeless Plain before reaching Ceduna.

Day 5: (CB, PD, Motel) From Ceduna we visit Streaky Bay on our way down the Flinders Highway towards Port Lincoln, named after the home town of Matthew Flinders who first visited this area in 1802. Fish and Chips dinner.

Day 6: (CB, MD, Motel) Port Lincoln is located on the banks of beautiful Boston Bay and is the base for Australia's largest tuna fleet and tuna farming industry. We enjoy a sightseeing cruise across the beautiful waters of Boston Bay. Learn about

Day 1: (MD, Motel) Fly to Kununurra via Broome where we settle into our motel for 4 nights and start to acclimatise to the Northern Wet.

Day 2: (FB, MD, Motel) Spend the day visiting attractions around Kununurra. A walk up Kelly's Knob gives a stunning view of the Ord River and

the irrigated farming land to the north. The Ord River Irrigation Area (Stage 1) covers 14,500 ha. With construction now started on Ord Stage 2 which could cover an irrigated area of up to 32,000 ha, with 75% being in WA and 25% in the NT. We tour around the farms of Sandalwood, Maize, Vegetables, Melons, Mangos and countless other crops. After lunch there is time to visit the town centre or have a swim in the motel pool.

Day 3: (FB, MD, Motel) Today is all about getting up in the air and viewing giant rivers snaking through the landscape. We take off from Kununurra and fly over The Bungle Bungle National Park, The Argyle Diamond Mine, Lake Argyle and the Ord River Irrigation Area. To see the size and power of the rivers in the wet leaves a lasting memory. In the afternoon over to the historic port of Wyndham, established by John Forrest in 1885 as a result of a gold rush at Halls Creek, and now the port centre for the

East Kimberley. From the top of the Five Rivers Lookout view the Ord, Forest, King, Durack and Pentecost rivers all emptying into the Cambridge Gulf. Note: Bungles flight included.

Day 4: (FB, MD, Motel) Travel to Lake Argyle, over the spillway for a cruise on the lake, looking out for crocodiles, wallaby's and fish while our guide informs us of the geology, history and environment of this picturesque area. After lunch, cruise down the Ord River 55km back to Kununurra. In the evening we can spot the red eyes of fresh water crocodiles on Lake Kununurra alongside our motel on our last night. Note: Lake Argyle and Ord River Cruises included.

Day 5: (FB) Departing Kununurra we fly over the Kimberley to Broome and return home after a memorable experience in "The Wet" of Northern Australia.

Note: Some modifications may need to be made due to weather conditions.

Day 1: (CAD, Tent in CVan Park) To Cunderdin, visiting the original pumping station (now museum) for the Goldfields Pipe Line. Onto Merredin, Southern Cross for Lunch and the historic town of Coolgardie. Note: Entry at Cunderdin included.

Day 2: (CAB, PL, CAD, Tent in CVan Park) A tour of Kalgoorlie, including the Super Pit, Boulder and the historic Two Up Ring. To Menzies, Leonora and the Sons of Gwalia Mine then camp at Laverton.

Day 3: (CAB, PL, CAD, Tent in Bush) We leave the bitumen and into the Great Victoria Desert past Warburton, tonight we enjoy a remote bush

camp, a wonderful experience in the desert.

Day 4: (CAB, PL, CAD, Tent in CVan Park) Through impressive range country in the Gibson Desert, named after explorer Alfred Gibson. Into the Giles Weather Station, the most remote in Australia, then on past Docker River and the Hull River to Kata Tjuta (The Olgas) and camp at Yulara.

Day 5: (CAB, PD, Tent in CVan Park) An interesting day at Uluru. Fly over it, wander around it, visit the Cultural Centre, Yulara Village and view the sunset on the Rock with a BBQ picnic. Note: Flight over Uluru not included, approx. \$200.

Day 6: (CAB, CAD, Tent in CVan Park) Off to Kings Canyon, which is a superb example of rich red Central Australian landscape. You have an afternoon to walk it as you will.

Day 7: (CAB, RD, Motel) Off early to the Alice for lunch then onto the very impressive Standley Chasm and Simpsons Gap, two wonderful features of the MacDonnell Ranges. Note: Standley Chasm entry included.

Day 8: (CAB, RD, Motel) Weather permitting you may take an optional Hot Air Balloon flight along the MacDonnell Ranges. We tour the original Telegraph Station, up Anzac Hill and around town and then drop you in town for you to wander. Note: Hot Air Balloon not included, approx. \$280. Telegraph Station included.

Day 9: (CAB, CAD, Underground Dorm no ensuite) South over the South Australian border to Marla Bore and Coober Pedy.

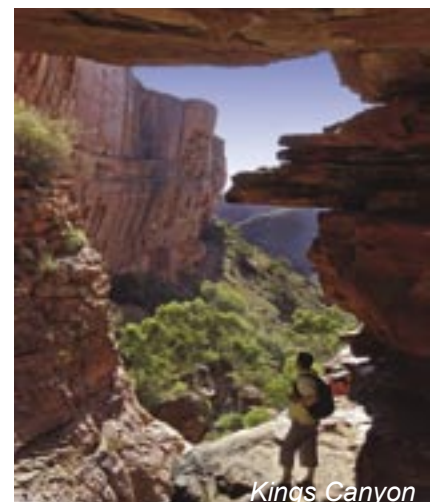
Day 10: (CAB, CAD, Tent in CVan Park) Coober Pedy is a fascinating place. One of the biggest towns in S.A, it is home to 92% of Australia's opals. People live underground to escape the summer heat. A morning tour and Opal display. Later we head east to William Creek situated just to the south west of Lake Eyre. Onto the Oodnadatta Track with numerous former small settlements that serviced the Ghan. Spend the night at Coward Springs Station. Note: Tour and Opal Display included.

Day 11: (CAB, CAD, Tent in CVan Park) The Lake Eyre Basin is a very special part of Australia. It covers one sixth of the continent and holds some of the rarest, least exploited ecosystems on the planet. We pass Lake Eyre and stop at Marree for an optional flight over the Lake. Later to the coal mining town of Leigh Creek, then to Hawker for two nights. Note: Flight over Lake Eyre not included, approx \$280.

Day 12: (CAB, CAD, Tent in CVan Park) A great drive through the spectacular Flinders Ranges, where some of the best Outback Scenery in Australia abounds. Wilpena Pound is a special spot. On return to Hawker we have time to visit the Wilpena Panorama.

Day 13: (CAB, RD, Motel) We travel towards Adelaide via Orroroo and Peterborough. After lunch have a guided town tour of the great heritage copper mining town of Burra. The whole town is classified by the National Trust. Later onto our accommodation in Elizabeth.

Day 14: (CB) Morning tour of Adelaide City with a visit to the Adelaide Botanical Garden and Glenelg before a flight home.

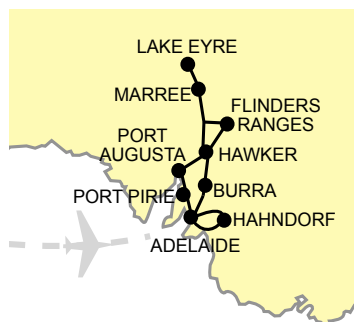

Day 1: (RD, Motel) We fly to Adelaide, where we are met by our coach. Then a tour of Adelaide City and surrounds, with free time to explore this delightful city including the Torrens River. Later settle into the accommodation in Elizabeth.

Day 2: (CB, MD, Motel) Heading north to Port Pirie. The destination for the lead and zinc ore from Broken Hill. Smelters have been in operation here since 1889, and it became the biggest lead smelter in the world by 1934. Port Pirie is also the home of the 'Shakka' model, at 5.5m it's the longest white pointer shark landed in South Australia. Onto Port Augusta at the northern point of the Spencer Gulf. We visit The Wadlata Outback Centre, a theatrical experience depicting a journey through time in the Flinders Ranges and the Outback of South Australia. In the late afternoon there is an optional boat cruise up the northern reaches of the Spencers Gulf, a unique way to view the Flinders Ranges, as they go through their colour display at sunset. Note: Wadlata Centre included. Boat cruise not included.

Day 3: (BB, MD, Motel) A morning visit the Arid Inland Botanical Gardens and the Matthew Flinders lookout over the upper reaches of the Gulf. Then we follow the Pichi Richi Railway up to Quorn then onto Hawker, the hub of the Flinders Ranges. In Hawker you may wish to visit the Wilpena Panorama a 33m long and 3.5m high artwork produced by Jeff Morgan. Later up to Leigh Creek which supplies the coal for the power stations at Port Augusta.

Day 4: (BB, RD, Motel) We leave the bitumen at Lyndhurst to arrive at Marree, at one time a major centre on the Ghan Railway to Alice Springs. Today is all about Lake Eyre, one of the largest lakes in Australia and also the lowest point on the continent. The Lake Eyre Basin is a very special part of Australia. It covers one sixth of the continent and holds some of the rarest, least exploited ecosystems on the planet. We visit its southern shores and have a flight over Lake Eyre. Later dinner before returning to Leigh

Creek. Note: 1.5 hour Lake Eyre flight included in your fare.

Day 5: (BB, MD, Motel) South to Parachilna where we head into the Flinders Ranges for a visit to Wilpena Pound first farmed by the Hill Family in 1899. Coming out of the Flinders Ranges return to Port Augusta.

Day 6: (CB, RD, Motel) We travel back towards Adelaide via Orroroo and Peterborough. After lunch have a guided town tour of the great heritage copper mining town of Burra. The whole town is classified by the National Trust. Later onto our accommodation in Elizabeth.

Day 7: (CB) Into the Adelaide Hills to Birdwood then onto Hahndorf. Settled by Lutheran migrants largely from Prussia, many of which were aboard the Zebra. The town is named after Captain Dirk Meinhertz Hahn, who was captain of the Zebra. German influence is very apparent in Hahndorf in the traditional 'fachwerk' architecture of the original surviving buildings. We return to Adelaide for our afternoon flight home after a fabulous tour of South Australia.

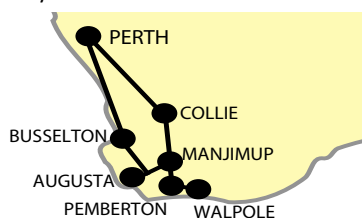

Day 1: (MD, Motel) To Harvey for morning tea, then via Collie, home of WA's Coal and Power Industry and Mumballup, Gnomesville to Donnybrook for lunch. Onto Balingup, Bridgetown and Manjimup.

Day 2: (FB, MD, Motel) To Pemberton and a wonderful trip through the forest on the Pemberton tram. Return to Manjimup and visit the Timber Museum. Note: Tram trip included.

Day 3: (FB, MD, Motel) Delightful drive through

the forest to Walpole, then a cruise on the Walpole and Nornalup Inlets. In the afternoon see the Valley of the Giants and Tree Top Walk. Note: Boat Cruise and Tree Top Walk included.

Day 4: (FB) Off to Nannup and the extreme South West corner, Cape Leeuwin. Augusta has magnificent views of the mouth of the Blackwood River. Onto Margaret River for lunch, then via Busselton on the banks of the Vasse River, Bunbury to Perth.

Day 1: (RD, Motel) Fly to Adelaide, where we are met by our coach. Then a tour of Adelaide City and surrounds, with free time to explore this delightful city including the Torrens River. Later settle into the accommodation in Elizabeth.

Day 2: (CB, MD, Motel) Along the Barrier Highway we stop in Burra for morning tea and town tour. Before visiting the childhood home of Sir Hubert Wilkins at Mt Bryan East. Wilkins was a polar explorer, pioneer pilot, geographer and pioneer submariner. From here onto Broken Hill where Charles Rasp in 1883 found silver and started Australia's leading company BHP.

Day 3: (FB, PD, Motel) BHP now no longer has a commercial interest in Broken Hill. A whole day in Broken Hill seeing the mining industry via Whites Gallery and town and a visit to the nearby town of Silverton where films such as "Mad Max" were shot. Later we enjoy an afternoon bush BBQ in this stunning country. Note: Whites Galley included.

Day 4: (FB, RD, Motel) Along the Barrier Highway to the historic Darling River Port of Wilcannia, now only a shell of its former busy self. Onto Cobar where copper has been mined since 1870. Then north to Bourke which began in 1862 it was the last outpost of civilization before the "Never Never" thus the saying "Back of Bourke". Bourke is a great experience with its grand sandstone buildings and history.



Silverton

Day 5: (CAB, RD, Motel) Bourke was a port on the Darling River for the paddle steamers and when the rail arrived the town became the largest wool rail head in the world. The new industry here is cotton production on fields irrigated from the Darling River. We visit the "Back of Bourke" Centre, an interesting interpretive centre delivering an in depth history of the region. In the afternoon we take a paddle steamer cruise down the Darling River on the PV Jandra. Note: Back of Bourke Centre and PV Jandra cruise included.

Day 6: (CAB, MD, Motel) Onto Queensland and Cunnamulla then north to Charleville, home of the Flying Doctor Base and original home of Cobb & Co for the building of its coaches. Charleville is an iconic Queensland location with large productive cattle stations.

Day 7: (CB, MD, Motel) Criss crossing the Warrego River we move to Blackall on the Barcoo River and Barcardine, the headquarters of the Great Shearers' Strike of 1891 which resulted in the formation of the Australia Labour Party. We stop in at The Australian Workers Heritage Centre, dedicated to celebrating the lives and proud heritage of ordinary working people – telling the stories of the railway workers and blacksmiths, the farmers, nurses and teachers who shaped the nation, on to Longreach. Note: Aust. Workers Heritage Centre included.

Day 8: (CB, RD, Motel) Longreach has great significance in Australia's history. It is the home of QANTAS (first office opened) and boasts the very impressive Stockman's Hall of Fame which we visit. In the afternoon we cruise the iconic Thompson River under the stars of Western Queensland. Note: Entry to the Hall of Fame and river cruise included.

Day 9: (CB, MD, Motel) The Australian history is continues today. We travel to Winton, the birth place of "Waltzing Matilda" written near here in 1885. There is an optional visit to the Waltzing Matilda Centre which celebrates the song as well as the life of Banjo Paterson. McKinlay where much of the film Crocodile Dundee was shot and Cloncurry, birthplace of the Flying Doctor Service. More recently it is the home of the BHP Cannington mine, the worlds largest silver and lead mine. Cannington was the official supplier of silver to the Sydney Olympics and Beijing Olympics. We spend two nights at Mount Isa. Note: Waltzing Matilda Centre not included.

Day 10: (CB, PD, Motel) A very interesting day touring Mt Isa, the largest outback town in Queensland and the world's largest single producer of copper, silver, lead and zinc. We have an underground mine tour and an optional visit to the WWII underground hospital places on the Queensland Heritage Register. In the afternoon visit Lake Moondarra on the Leichhardt River for an outback BBQ dinner. Note: Mine tour included in your fare. Underground Hospital not included.

Day 11: (CB, PD, Motel) Heading to the Gulf of Carpentaria we arrive in the remote cattle town of Normanton. In the late afternoon we travel to Karumba on the Gulf of Carpentaria to enjoy fish and chips

as the sun sets over The Gulf. We return after dinner to Normanton

Day 12: (CB, MD, Motel) Off to the east, along the Gulf Developmental Road to Croydon, we lunch at Georgetown before spending the night at Mt Surprise.

Day 13: (CB, RD, Motel) On to one of the great wonders of Australia "The Undara Lava Tubes" the world's largest lava tube system. East through the Great Dividing Range to Cairns. Note: Tour of Lava Tubes included.

Day 14: (CB, Motel) Travel along a spectacular coastline to the lush Daintree River, where we have a boat cruise then time for lunch at the resort town of Port Douglas. We return to Cairns for a free afternoon on the esplanade of Cairns, with many cafes and restaurants, galleries, markets and stalls it is a lovely coastal Queensland city. Note: Daintree cruise included.

Day 15: (CB) We have a late check out and relax in Cairns. Opportunity to visit the Cairns Wildlife Dome, a spectacular all-weather wildlife exhibit enclosed by a 20 metre high glass dome on top of Cairns' iconic Pullman Reef Hotel Casino. Or head out to Lake Barrine for a tranquil cruise and famous Devonshire Teas on a 10,000-year-old freshwater lake. (Depending on departure flight times.) Note: Wildlife Dome and Lake Barrine Cruise not included.

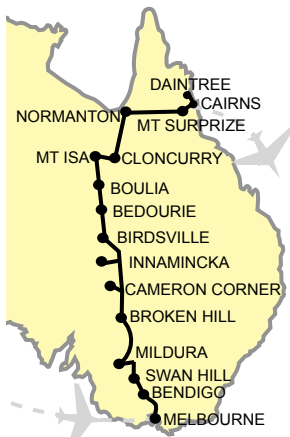

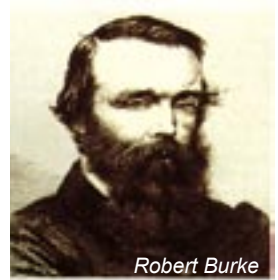
Day 1: (RD, Motel) Fly to Melbourne from where Burke and Wills set off on the 20th August 1860. We meet up with our party and settle into our motel.

Day 2: (CB, RD, Motel) We head into Melbourne to visit the Monument of Burke and Wills in the CBD, the Royal Society of Victoria Building and Royal Park where the party set off from. In the afternoon we visit central Melbourne.

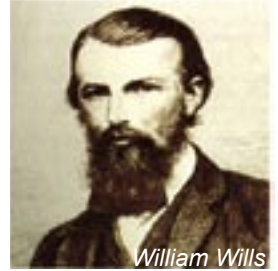
Day 3: (CB, RD, Motel) Heading north through Lancefield to Bendigo. Here we view this Historic Goldmining Town which helped make Victoria the richest of the colonies. Continuing after lunch to

In 1860–61, Robert O'Hara Burke and William John Wills led an expedition of 19 men with the intention of crossing Australia from Melbourne in the south to the Gulf of Carpentaria in the north, a distance of around 3,250 kilometres. At that time most of inland Australia had not been explored by non-indigenous people and was completely unknown to the European settlers.

This tour visits many of the landmarks on their historic journey, while also including many of the interesting features and attractions that have been developed over the last 150 years.

Day 4: (CB, PD, Motel) A morning in Swan Hill, we visit the Pioneer Settlement, wander at leisure in a bygone world experiencing real Australian history. Into New South Wales and Balranald, here on the 15th September the expedition left behind their sugar, lime juice and some of their guns and ammunition. In the afternoon a paddle steamer cruise from Mildura with Fish and Chips Dinner on board. Note: Pioneer Settlement and Paddle Boat Cruise included.

Day 5: (CB, PL, MD, Motel) Over to Wentworth where the Murray and Darling Rivers meet. We follow the east side of the Darling to Pooncarie then take the dirt road to Menindee and spend two nights in Broken Hill.

Day 6: (FB, CAD, Motel) An interesting town tour of Broken Hill followed by a museum mine tour at Whites Galley. There is free time to wander town or visit the historic railway museum. In the afternoon we visit Silverton for a bush BBQ. Note: Whites Galley Included.

Day 7: (FB, PL, CAD, Motel) Up the Silver City Highway to Depot Glen, a base camp used by Charles Sturt on his attempt to find the inland sea. Continuing to Tibooburra before heading out to Cameron's Corner, the junction of three states SA, NSW & QLD then and returning to Tibooburra.

Day 8: (CAB, PL, CAD, Tent in Bush) Through the Warri Warri Gate into Queensland to the Burke & Wills Dig Tree on the Cooper Creek, camp 65 for the expedition. It was in this area on the return journey that both Burke and Wills died leaving King alone, the sole survivor of the party. We visit Burke's Grave on the Cooper Creek and Innamincka and have a bush camp in the remote outback.

Day 9: (CAB, PL, MD, Motel) On to extraordinary Birdsville on the Diamantina River in south west Queensland, we visit the race track, and town. A memorable night at the famous Birdsville Hotel, a classic outback pub full of history.

Day 10: (CB, PL, RD, Motel) To Bedourie and Boulia, home of the mysterious Min Min Light phenomenon. We continue up the Channel Country to Mount Isa.

Day 11: (CB, PD, Motel) A full day

in Mt Isa, we visit the Flying Doctor Information Centre and have an optional underground mine or war hospital tour. After lunch we visit Lake Moondarra just out of town. Note: Flying Doctor Centre entry included. Mine and Hospital entry not included.

Day 12: (CB, CAD, Tent in Bush) Only 400km to the Gulf of Carpentaria. This section was extremely taxing on Burke and Wills. We visit the memorial on the Barkly Highway before reaching Cloncurry. Up the road to the Burke and Wills Roadhouse which sits on another of their campsites. Tonight we camp near the Cairn on the Bynoe River, Camp 119, where King and Gray waited while Burke and Wills completed the south to north crossing.

Day 13: (CAB, CAD, Tents in CVan Park) Off to Karumba to get a view of the Gulf of Carpentaria, we then return to Normanton. In the afternoon we travel through Croydon and Georgetown to Mt Surprise.

Day 14: (CB, RD, Motel) The Undara Lava Tubes are amazing ancient lava flow tunnels through the earth. We tour the tunnel system before heading over the Great Dividing Range to Cairns. Note: Lava Tubes entry included.

Day 15: (CB, Motel) Travel along a spectacular coastline to the lush Daintree River, where we have a boat cruise then time for lunch at the resort town of Port Douglas. We return to Cairns for a free afternoon on the esplanade of Cairns, with many cafes and restaurants, galleries, markets and stalls it is a lovely coastal Queensland city. Note: Daintree cruise included.

Day 16: (CB) Free time in Cairns in the morning before a flight home after a memorable, historic tour following two of the most celebrated explorers of inland Australia.

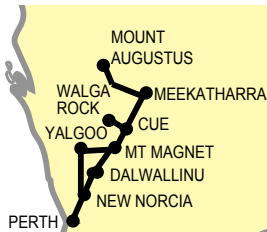

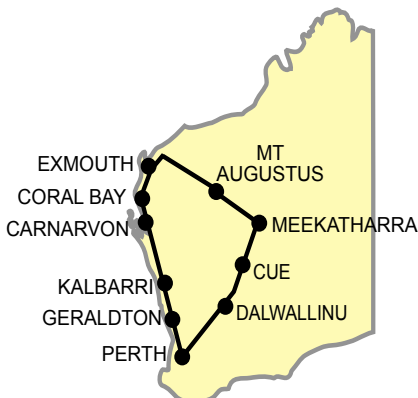

Day 1: (PD, Motel) We fly to Cairns where we are met by the coach and transferred to our motel for a light supper.

Day 2: (CB, Motel) A delightful day in the Cairns hinterland. Firstly a drive to Lake Barrine for a boat cruise on this beautiful forest lined mountain lake. Then onto Atherton for lunch. In the afternoon a visit to the beautiful mountain town of Kuranda. You then have the option of

travelling down the scenic mountain highway to Cairns by coach or taking the Sky Rail Rainforest Cable Way. Free time in the evening on the vibrant foreshore of Cairns for dinner. Note: Lake Barrine Boat Cruise included. Sky Rail not included.

Day 3: (CB, MD, Motel) Travel along a spectacular coastline to Port Douglas and the lush Daintree River, where we have a boat cruise. Return to Mossman and start to head up The Cape to Lakeland and Cooktown. In June 1770, the local Aboriginal Guugu Yimithirr tribe cautiously watched the crippled Endeavour limp up the coast seeking a safe harbour after sustaining serious damage south of Cooktown. Note: Daintree Cruise included.

Day 4: (CB, PL, CAD, Tent in CVan Park) After a visit to the Botanical Gardens and the James Cook Museum its back to Lakeland onto the Peninsula Development Road we visit the Split Rock Art Site. This Country contains a large and dramatic body of prehistoric rock paintings. Through Hahn River to Musgrave Roadhouse. Note: James Cook Museum entry included.

Day 5: (CAB, CAD, Tent at CVan Park) To Coen for Morning Tea, the largest inland town on The Cape, via Archer River to Weipa. Weipa started as a Presbyterian Mission to the Aboriginal people

of the Cape but is now the largest settlement on the cape due to a large Bauxite Deposit in the region mined by Rio Tinto. We camp at Weipa on the banks of the Arafura Sea.

Day 6: (CAB, PL, CAD, Tent CVan Park) Departing Weipa we head back to the Telegraph Road in the centre of the Peninsular via Batavia Downs Station for Lunch at the Old Moreton Telegraph Station. Then continue up through the Heathlands Resource Reserve to the Jardine River.

Day 7: (CAB, PL, CAD, Tent in CVan Park) As the northern most tip of the country gets closer the journey becomes progressively more spectacular. We cross the Jardine River on the Vehicle Ferry and drive to Bamaga, just kilometres from the tip. Bamaga was settled by people from Saibai Island in Torres Strait, after Saibai Island was devastated by abnormally high tides. We camp for the next two nights on the foreshore at Seisia.

Day 8: (CAB, PL, CAD, Tent in CVan Park) Today is all about reaching the Cape. We take the final slow drive through thick forest to the Northern most Tip of Australia named by James Cook on 21 August 1770 in honour of Prince Edward, Duke of York and Albany. We drive as far as we can but then have to walk out over the rocks to the tip. From there it is 160km to New Guinea across the Torres Strait. We return to Seisia to celebrate reaching this iconic Australian location. In the afternoon there is an optional Helicopter Flight over the Endeavour Strait, The Cape and scattered Islands. Note: Helicopter Flight not included, approx. \$200.

Day 9: (CAB, RD, Motel) From Seisia we take the ferry to Thursday Island. TI is the administrative and commercial centre of the Torres Strait Islands set up in 1877. Since then TI has been a pearling centre and defence base during WWII. We tour the island including the WWII tunnels and emplacements, the afternoon is free time. We have our last night of the tour on the Island.

Day 10: (CB) Ferry transfer to Horn Island, next to Thursday Island, where the airport is located and return to Cairns, then fly home having reached the northern most point of Australia.

Day 1: (PL, Motel) We fly to Cairns to begin our Queensland adventure. We are transferred to the hotel and have a light supper meal.

Day 2: (CB, RD, Motel) Early this morning you have the option of a Hot Air Balloon over the Atherton Tablelands. We visit the redeveloped Cairns foreshore and have free time in the city for lunch before a cruise on Hartley's Lagoon, feeding crocodiles and exploring the bio-diversity of Northern Queensland. In the afternoon we travel up the coast to Port Douglas for our evening meal. After dinner return to Cairns. Note: Hartley's Lagoon included. Hot Air Balloon not included.

Day 3: (CB, MD, Motel) Travelling down the coast through Innisfail, Mission Beach and Tully, this area was severely damaged in early February 2011 by Cyclone Yasi. Many crops, houses and buildings are slowly being re-established. We reach Townsville, home of one of the largest army bases in Australia, Lavarack.

Day 4: (CB, MD, Motel) We take a ferry to Magnetic Island just off the coast from Townsville. You can relax on the island and return to Townsville to enjoy the newly beautified city and foreshore. While in the city you may visit Reef HQ, the world's largest living coral reef aquarium. In the afternoon we leave the Coast and head inland to Charters Towers. Note: Magnetic Island Ferry

included. Reef HQ not included.

Day 5: (CB, MD, Motel) Charters Towers with its beautiful period main street, started in 1871 when a 12 year old boy found Gold on the site. We spend time in town in the morning then head south parallel to the Great Dividing Range through Clermont to Emerald.

Day 6: (FB, PD, Motel) Heading to the Gemfields of Sapphire and Rubyvale to the west of Emerald for a morning visit. We return to Emerald for lunch and time to visit the ornate Railway Station or the Botanic Gardens. Later we head out to the Fairbairn Dam and Lake Maraboon, one of the largest artificial lakes in the country, built to service the huge cotton industry of the region. We enjoy a BBQ dinner on the banks of the lake and return to Emerald.

Day 7: (FB, PL, RD, Motel) Today we get off early with a picnic lunch to Carnarvon Gorge. The gorge in this stunning national park is accessible by a 10+ km walk track starting from a beautiful picnic area often frequented by kangaroos and other wildlife. In the afternoon we leave the gorge and reach Roma. In the evening we visit the "Big Rig" display, depicting the history of Roma's Oil and Gas Industry. Note: Big Rig entry included.

Day 8: (CB, RD, Motel) We tour around Roma visiting the Roma Saleyards, the largest in Australia. View the courthouse where Captain Starlight was tried and acquitted. After lunch move on to Toowoomba.

Day 9: (CB, PD, Motel) Toowoomba was flooded in early 2011 causing massive damage to this beautiful city. We tour the city including the Japanese Gardens and the city centre. There is an optional visit to the Cobb & Co Museum, Newton Park State Rose Garden or the Transport and Main Roads Heritage Centre. In the early evening we enjoy Fish and Chips at Picnic Point Lookout. Note: Cobb & Co, Rose Garden & Main Roads not included.

Day 10: (CB, MD, Motel) Into Esk before driving along Lake Wivenhoe which has been topical in Brisbane since the city flooded in early 2011. The Brisbane Valley Highway crosses over the Dam Wall as we drive towards Brisbane.

Day 11: (CB, RD, Motel) A morning drive up Mt Coot-tha before free time in the City. Brisbane is a vibrant busy city built around the banks of the Brisbane River. Within walking distance are the Casino and the "Wheel of Brisbane". Other options are a cruise on the river or a tour of the XXXX Castlemaine Brewery just out of town. We dine at a restaurant and return to the accommodation. Note: Wheel of Brisbane, River Cruise and XXXX tour not included.

The speech is credited with re-igniting the debate that ultimately lead to Federation on 1 January 1901. Continue through the Great Dividing Range to Glen Innes and Armidale.

Day 14: (CB, MD, Motel) An optional morning Helicopter flight over the Great Dividing Range's scenic rugged scenery. To Tamworth on the Peel River, the Country Music Capital of Australia", annually hosting the Tamworth Country Music Festival in late January. We visit the Australian Country Music Hall of Fame and the Big Golden Guitar. In the afternoon to Coonabarabran. Note: Country Music Hall of Fame included. Helicopter not included.

Day 15: (CB, RD, Motel) Gilgandra on the Castlereagh River before Dubbo, the largest town in the Orana Region. We visit to the Western Plains Zoo, which is home to various species of endangered animals, including the White, Black and Indian Rhinoceros. Note: Western Plains Zoo included.

Day 16: (CB, MD, Motel) To the Australian Telescope Visitors Centre north of Parkes, this facility has assisted NASA for several missions as a Southern Hemisphere relay and communications station and was made famous by the movie "The Dish". Later to Forbes on the Lachlan River. Note: Telescope Centre included.

Day 17: (CB, RD, Motel) Continuing down the Newell Highway to West Wyalong and Narrandera the gateway to the productive Murrumbidgee Irrigation Area. In the afternoon we leave New South Wales and enter Victoria at Echuca on the Murray River.

Day 18: (CB, MD, Motel) In the 1870s Echuca had risen to prominence as Australia's largest inland port, we visit the historic Port and take a Paddle Steamer on the river. Later to the beautiful Gold Rush town of Bendigo. Note: Paddle boat included

Day 19: (CB, MD, Motel) Bendigo is notable for its Victorian architectural heritage and gold mining history. Since 1851 over 22 million ounces of gold have been extracted from its goldmines. 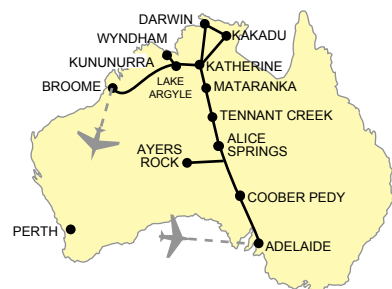

Day 1: (RD, Motel) We fly to Adelaide, where we are met by our coach. Then a tour of Adelaide City and surrounds, with free time to explore this delightful city including the Torrens River. Later settle into the accommodation in Elizabeth.

Day 3: (CB, MD, Motel) A visit to Woomera, the home of the 1950's Blue Streak Rocket Project as well as many Space Research Projects over the last 60 years. Visitors can visit the 'Woomera Heritage Centre' or the 'National Missile Park', displaying aircraft rockets and bombs. Then continue north to Coober Pedy for two nights.

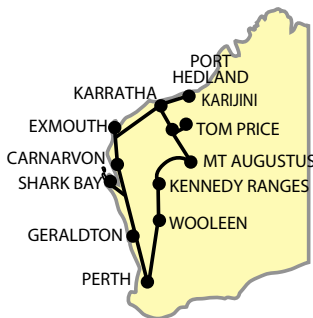
