Day 1: (MD, Motel) Heading off on Australia's Longest Shortcut we climb up the Darling Scarp through the Wheatbelt to the WA Goldfields.

Day 2: (CB, RD, Basic Motel) Touring Kalgoorlie including the lookout over the Superpit, Australia's Largest Open Cut Gold Mine. North to Menzies after a visit to the historic Two-Up Ring we travel through mining towns of all sizes and minerals, Ghost Towns to Cities from Nickel to Gold. Visit the Gwalia Museum on the edge of the large open pit Sons of Gwalia Mine. Note: Museum entry included.

Day 3: (CB, PL, RD, Motel) Onto the first of many dirt roads on this tour just north of Laverton; The Great Central Road, winding through the ranges, sandhills and salt lakes of the Desert has a beauty that is iconically Australian. We arrive at Warburton for the night.

Day 4: (CAB, PL, PD, Motel) Passing the Schwerin Mural Ranges to cross into Northern Territory through the Gibson Desert. Deep into the South West corner of the NT we visit Lasseters Cave and learn a little of the mystery of Lewis Lasseter and his elusive reef of gold. Past Uluru before settling into Curtin Springs Station.

Day 5: (CB, PD, Motel) The Uluru-Kata Tjuta National Park is listed as a UNESCO World Heritage Site, after a day in the park you will see why. We spend the morning at Uluru and the information centre. Return to Yulara Village for lunch and an optional helicopter flight over the spectacular sandstone formations. Later visit Kata Tjuta (The Olgas) to walk through the valleys between the mighty domes. Enjoy a picnic dinner watching the sunset over Uluru, before returning to Curtin Springs. Note: Optional Flight over Uluru approx \$335.

Day 6: (CB, RD, Motel) We spend the morning on Curtin Springs Station, home to the Severin family since 1956, when Peter Severin arrived with his young wife Dawn, their toddler son Ashley and 1,500 head of cattle. The Severin family has protected the million acre wildlife corridor that balances cattle production with conservation of this precious landscape. Appreciate a tour of the handmade paper, made from the native grasses found on the station, a distinctive and beautiful souvenir of Central Australia. Afternoon through to Alice Springs for three nights. Note: Paper Tour included.

Day 7: (CAB, RD, Motel) A restful morning before a day exploring some of the features of the MacDonnell Ranges, from scenic to culturally significant areas.



Perth - Alice Springs - Cairns



Day 8: (CAB, Motel) Take an optional early morning Hot Air Balloon through the rugged outback followed by a tour of "The Alice" nestled on the north side of the MacDonnell Ranges. In the afternoon there is an optional visit to the Alice Springs Telegraph Station. Note: Optional Hot Air Balloon approx \$440.

Day 9: (CAB, PL, RD, Motel) An early start for a big drive into Queensland. A short drive up the Stuart Highway then back on the dirt of the Plenty Highway. Through the Harts, Jervois, Tarlton and Toko Ranges in the northern reaches of the Simpson Desert to Tobermorey Station just inside the Northern Territory border. Crossing the border on the Donohue Highway shadowing the Georgina River with its many tributaries to Boulia. This highway is the home of the Min Min Lights, an unusual shimmering light phenomenon that can appear at night.

Day 10: (CB, MD, Motel) A late start with free time in Boulia before continuing across the Queensland Channel Country and over the Diamantina which flows south past Birdsville to Lake Eyre, in the afternoon we reach the sheep cattle town of Winton on the sprawling Western River.

Day 11: (CB, Motel) Morning visit to the Age of Dinosaurs Centre, the world's largest collection of Australian dinosaur fossils. In the afternoon we visit the Waltzing Matilda Centre followed by free time in Winton and a wander of this romantic, classic outback QLD town. Note: Dinosaur and Waltzing Matilda Centres entries included.

Day 12: (CB, RD, Motel) To Hughenden before a drive up the Flinders River and a visit to the Porcupine Gorge Lookout on the last of the outback dirt roads to reach Mount Surprise on the Gulf Development Road.

Day 13: (CB, PL, MD, Motel) We take a guided tour through the Undara Lava Tubes, the world's longest lava flow from a single volcano, some of the caves are over 21m wide and up to 10m high. Note: Lava Tubes Tour included.

Day 14: (CB, RD, Motel) Past Mount Garnet and Ravenshoe before descending the Great Dividing Range through the winding rainforest highway enjoying the lush rainforest and tropical plantations on the way into Cairns.

Day 15: (CB) Slow morning with time to relax around Cairns before a flight home having crossed the Country South West to North East through a great range of landscapes and vegetation, an unforgettable experience.

Day 1: (MD, Motel) Up the Darling Scarp on Great Eastern Highway through the wheatbelt to Merredin and Southern Cross for Lunch. A visit to Coolgardie with its wide main street before the historic gold mining town of Kalgoorlie.

Day 2: (CB, RD, Motel) A tour of Kalgoorlie, including the Super Pit, Boulder and the rustic Two Up Ring. To Menzies, Leonora and the Sons of Gwalia Mine then Laverton.

Day 3: (CB, PL, RD, Motel) We leave the bitumen and into the Great Victoria Desert to Warburton, a wonderful place to experience in the desert.

Day 4: (CAB, PL, MD, Motel) Through the impressive range country in the Gibson Desert, named after explorer Alfred Gibson. To the Giles Weather Station, the most remote in Australia, set up to take readings for the Blue Streak Rocket Project. Then on past Docker River and the Hull River, past Kata Tjuta to Uluru to Curtin Springs.

Day 5: (CB, PD, Motel) A very interesting day at Uluru. We visit the Cultural Centre before some of the features of Uluru. Later there is an opportunity to visit the Yulara village or take a scenic helicopter flight over the park. In the afternoon off to Kata Tjuta with its majestic domes. Enjoy picnic dinner while we watch the sunset on the Rock. Note: Entry to National Park included. Flight over Uluru not included, approx \$335.

Day 6: (CB, RD, Motel) We spend the morning on Curtin Springs Station, home to the Severin family since 1956, when Peter Severin arrived with his young wife Dawn, their toddler son Ashley and 1,500 head of cattle. The Severin family has protected the million acre wildlife corridor that balances cattle production with conservation of this precious landscape. Appreciate a tour of the handmade paper, made from the native grasses found on the station, a distinctive and beautiful souvenir of Central Australia. Afternoon through to Alice Springs for three nights. Note: Paper Tour included.

Day 7: (CAB, RD, Motel) A restful morning before a day exploring some of the features of the MacDonnell Ranges, from scenic to culturally significant areas.

Day 8: (CAB, Motel) Weather permitting you may take an optional Hot Air Balloon flight along the MacDonnell Ranges. We tour town, Anzac Hill and Todd River, then drop you in town for you to wander before an optional visit to Alice Springs Telegraph Station. Note: Hot Air Balloon not included, approx. \$440.

Day 9: (CAB, MD, Motel) We drive south over the South Australian border to Marla Bore and Coober Pedy for two nights.

Day 10: (CB, Motel) Coober Pedy is a fascinating place. One of the biggest towns in S.A, it is home to 92% of Australia's opals. People live underground to escape the summer heat. A morning tour and Opal display and an afternoon "noodle" for opals around town. Note: Tour and Opal Display included.

Day 11: (CB, PL, MD, Motel) Head east to William Creek situated just to the south west of Lake Eyre. Onto the Oodnadatta Track with numerous former small settlements that serviced the Ghan. The Lake Eyre Basin is a very special part of Australia. It covers one sixth of the continent and holds some of the rarest, least exploited ecosystems on the planet. We pass Lake Eyre and stop at Marree for an optional flight over the Lake. Note: Flight over Lake Eyre not included, approx \$475.

Day 12: (CB, MD, Motel) A great drive through the spectacular Flinders Ranges, where some of the best outback scenery in Australia abounds. In the morning we visit Blinman then head through the ranges to Hawker to view the Wilpena Panorama; Jeff Morgans 360 degree painting. In the afternoon we head out of the ranges via the Pichi-Richi Pass to Port Augusta, at the head of the Spencers Gulf. Note: Gallery entry included.

Day 13: (CB, PD, Motel) We visit The Wadlata Outback Centre, a theatrical experience depicting a journey through time in the Flinders Ranges and the Outback of South Australia. Later we visit the Arid Inland Botanical Gardens and the Matthew Flinders lookout over the upper reaches of the Gulf. Onto the Eyre Highway to Ceduna. Note: Wadlata Centre and Botanical Gardens included.

Day 14: (CB, RD, Motel) Onto the Nullarbor and toward Western Australia, we view the Great Australian Bight from the spectacular cliffs.

Day 15: (CB, MD, Motel) We are well and truly on the way home. Now we leave the coast for lunch at Norseman before heading past Lake Johnston and arriving at Hyden for our last night of the tour.

Day 16: (FB) A morning visit to Wave Rock and Hippos Yawn on the edge of the wheatbelt before returning to Perth after a most enjoyable tour. Note: Wave Rock entry included.

Day 1: (MD, Motel) Taking the Indian Ocean Drive out of Perth, we take in the sparkling Indian Ocean on our West as we head into the Pinnacle Desert for morning tea and a walk through the landscape. Through many cray fishing towns; Jurien Bay, Green Head & Leeman, to Dongara for lunch. Visit the HMAS Sydney Memorial overlooking Geraldton, via Northampton to Kalbarri. Note: Pinnacles Entry included.

Day 2: (FB, PD, Motel) To Kalbarri National Park and the Skywalk, perched right on the cliff-top, two 100-metre-high lookouts projecting 25 and 17 metres beyond the rim of the Murchison Gorge. Also visit the stunning gorges of Z Bend & Natures Window. Lunch in Kalbarri at the mouth of the Murchison River. In the afternoon we explore the coastal gorges and bluffs. Note: National Park entry included.

Day 3: (FB, MD, Motel) Returning to the North West Coastal Highway the country changes to open plains and sprawling sheep stations. Continuing to Carnarvon on the Gascoyne River.

Day 4: (FB, MD, Motel) Exploring Carnarvon we drive by the plantations on the banks of the Gascoyne before heading up to the Carnarvon Space and Technology Museum to learn about the role of this dish in the 1969 Apollo 11 moon landing. Note: Space Museums included.

Day 5: (FB, MD, Motel) We continue North to Coral Bay with free time to swim on the Ningaloo Reef. Up Charles Knife Road in the Cape Range National Park, a beautiful, rugged, iconic WA coastline. We stay the night at Exmouth, the centre for the Navy North West Cape Base and the Harold E Holt Communications Base.





Hutt Lagoon, Pink Lake, Port Gregory

Day 6: (CB, MD, Motel) We travel to the head of the Gulf to take in the view from the Vlamingh Lighthouse. Out on a glass bottom boat cruise to view the striking coral of Ningaloo Reef. Returning to Exmouth with an optional Whale Watching cruise in the afternoon or time to relax by the pool. Note: Glass bottom boat included. Whale watching not included, approx \$95.

Day 7: (CB, MD, Motel) Leaving the Cape and the Coast we enter the Pilbara and the spinifex covered ranges which houses an enormous amount of Australia's Iron Ore. We reach Tom Price, WA's highest town above sea level.

Day 8: (CB, PL, PD, Motel) Into Karijini National Park, some of the gorges we see today are as impressive as any you would see in Australia. We visit Dales Gorge, Circular Pool and Fortescue Falls at the East end of the park as well as Oxer and Junction Pool lookouts in the West end.

Day 9: (CB, PL, MD, Motel) Departing Tom Price we follow the Rio Tinto railway line towards the coast. Passing through Millstream - Chichester National Park an oasis in the desert nestled within the chocolate brown rocks of the Chichester Range dotted with spinifex and snappy gums. In the afternoon we reach the massive export facilities of the Pilbara.

Day 10: (CB, RD, Motel) Originally developed for Iron Ore export Karratha's economic export base now includes sea-salt, ammonia and Liquefied Natural Gas from the North West Shelf, Pluto and Gorgon. We tour around this swiftly growing town and Dampier in its hue of red dust and high vis.

Day 11: (CB, RD, Motel) Morning visit to Cossack, the oldest port on the Pilbara coast. To Port Hedland still pumping out millions of tonnes of Ore from around Newman.

Day 12: (CB, MD, Motel) Finishing off our drive along the Great Northern Highway through Pardoo, Sandfire and the Roebuck Plains to Broome.

Day 13: (FB, PD, Motel) John Forrest chose the location of Broome in 1883 and the Pearling industry quickly moved in to set its base up in the protection of Roebuck Bay. A multicultural town, the influences of many nations are still evident in the architecture, cuisine and people. We tour the town, Gantheaume Point and have a picnic dinner on Cable Beach watching the last sunset of our journey.

Day 14: (FB) Optional tour to Willie Creek Pearl Farm before we fly out, having loved the West Australian Coast, National Parks and the beautiful Indian Ocean. Note: Willie Creek Tour not included, approx \$125.

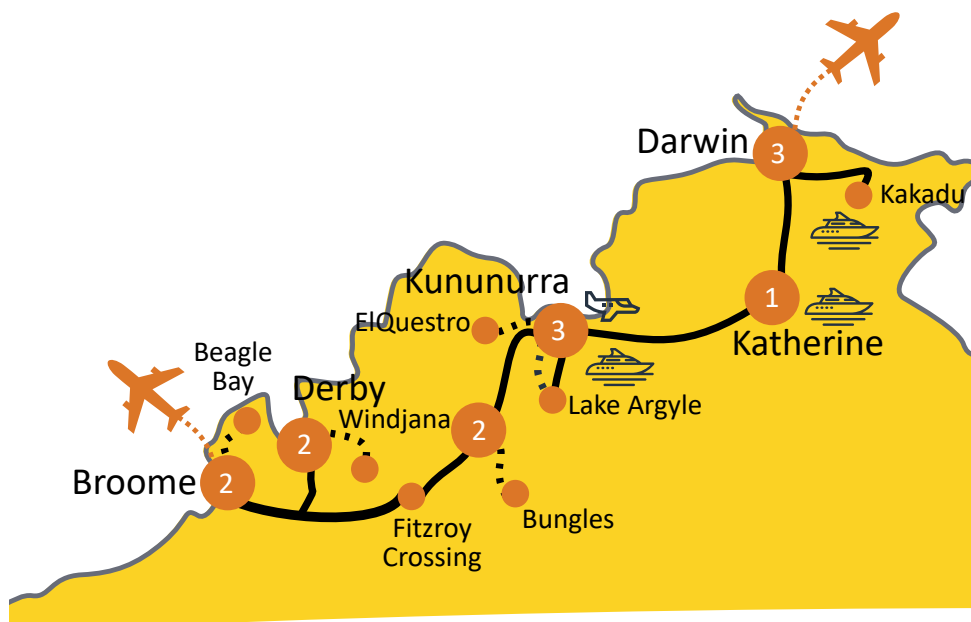
Day 3: (CB, MD, Motel) To the banks of the Fitzroy River which runs 733km from high in the King Leopold Ranges to the mouth in King Sound. We stop at Willare before reaching Derby for two nights.

Day 4: (FB, PL, PD, Motel) East on the Gibb River Road to the Napier Range and Windjana Gorge* for lunch before a wander along the Lennard River with a great number of crocodiles basking on the sandbanks in the sun. Skirting the Oscar Range to Tunnel Creek, we have the opportunity to walk through this 750m, 15m wide and up to 12m high tunnel; one of WA's most interesting natural features. Returning to Derby. Note: Park entry included.

Day 5: (FB, RD, Motel) Back on the Great Northern Highway we hit the river again at the town of Fitzroy Crossing. Through the Mueller Ranges and Mary Pool to Halls Creek, one of the early settlements of the Kimberley, now the northern end of the Tanami Track and Canning Stock Route.

Day 6: (CB, PL, MD, Motel) We cross the Ord River for the first time and reach the start of the Spring Creek Track. Taking the windy track into Purnululu National Park to visit The Bungle Bungle Range with an elevation as high as 578m. The famous sandstone domes are unusual and visually striking with their stripes in alternating orange and grey bands. The banding of the domes is due to differences in clay content and porosity of the sandstone layers. Take the hike into Cathedral Gorge and around the majestic domes. Return to Halls Creek. Note: Park entry included.

Day 7: (CB, MD, Motel) North to the hub of the East Kimberley, Kununurra, a truly amazing place; beautiful, fertile, interesting and relaxing. We tour through the irrigated fields and visit the Stonecraft Gallery and Hoochery Distillery.

Day 1: (MD, Motel) Along the Indian Ocean Drive to the Pinnacles in Nambung National Park, enjoy morning tea as you wander this interesting landscape. Lunch in Jurien Bay, a major base for the WA fishing industry. In the afternoon we explore Lesueur National Park, the second most diverse flora region in WA. On to Port Denison and Geraldton. Note: Entry to Nambung & Lesueur included.

Day 2: (FB, MD, Motel) After a visit to Geraldton's HMAS Sydney Memorial we continue on the North West Coastal Hwy to Binu with a bush morning tea amongst the flowers then via the Ajana Rd to reach the coast at the mouth of the Murchison River. Lunch in Kalbarri. In the afternoon a visit to Red Bluff then via the coastal road to Northampton and later return to Geraldton.

Day 3: (FB, MD, Motel) East to Mingenew and the Coalseam Conservation Park where the Gregory brothers discovered coal exposed within the sedimentary layers of the banks of the Irwin River in 1846. Now in good years its renowned for its native pink and white everlastings. Through the wheat, canola and wildflowers to Dalwallinu on the Great Northern Highway.

Day 4: (FB, MD, Motel) We travel north along the Great Northern Highway into the Station and Goldfields country. We are out in the scrub searching for a range of flowers including the beautiful Wreath Leschenaultia, a unique flower often growing in disturbed gravel. In the afternoon it is out of the station country to return to Dalwallinu.

Day 5: (FB, MD, Motel) South to Wongan Hills and out through the wildflowers to cross the Great Eastern Highway. We take a walk through the historic town of York and stop at the Corrigin Dog Cemetery before reaching Hyden.

Day 6: (FB, MD, Motel) We spend the day exploring the interesting features of the region, Wave Rock, Hippos Yawn, The Lace Place, Toy Soldier Display, and Mulkas Cave. During the day we hope to find Orchids, Verticordia, Cassia, Grevillea, Damperia and others, before returning to Hyden. Note: All entries included.

Day 7: (FB, MD, Motel) Travelling via the Tin Horse Highway to Kulin, Eucalyptus macrocarpa is the flora emblem of the Shire of Kulin, we take a walk along the Macrocarpa Walk Trail. To Lake Grace for lunch then back on the road to Albany.

Day 8: (FB, MD, Motel) The area of Australia which produces the widest variety of wildflowers. The great gem of the Great Southern is the Stirling Ranges. Later we visit Mt Barker and an island of Karri, the Porongurups. Return to Albany.

Day 9: (FB, MD, Motel) On to the majestic Tinglewood Trees and the Valley of the Giants treetop walk, then via Denmark and Walpole to the Karri Forests of Manjimup. After lunch we enjoy a delightful drive through the forest to Nannup, an interesting quirky town on the banks of the Blackwood River. Arriving at Abbey Beach resort on Geographe Bay.

Day 10: (FB, MD, Motel) Exploring the Leeuwin Naturaliste National Park and its limestone kaste caves. We descend into Ngilgi Cave with its ornate stalactites. Afternoon visit to Margaret River and stop off for a wine tasting before returning to Busselton. Note: Cave & Wine Tasting included.

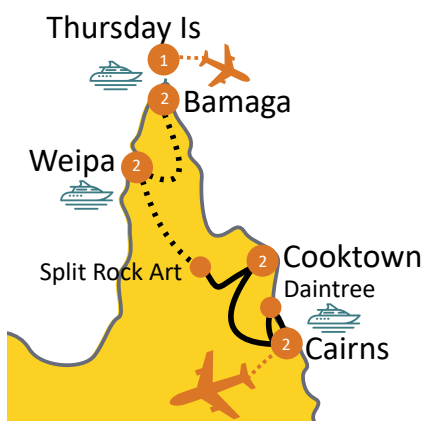

Day 1: (PD, Motel) We fly to Cairns where we are met by the coach and transferred to our motel. Note: Flights arriving after 6pm will have snack evening meal provided in the room.

Day 2: (CB, RD, Motel) Travel along a spectacular coastline to the lush Daintree River, where we have a boat cruise then time for lunch at the resort town of Port Douglas. We return to Cairns for a free afternoon on The Esplanade, with many cafés, restaurants, galleries, markets and stalls. It is a lovely coastal Queensland city. Note: Daintree cruise included.

Day 3: (CB, MD, Motel) We head up the Atherton Tablelands to Mareeba then begin up "The Cape" to Lakeland and Cooktown. In June 1770, the local Aboriginal Guugu Yimithirr tribe cautiously watched the crippled Endeavour limp up the coast seeking a safe harbour after sustaining serious damage south of Cooktown.

Day 4: (CB, RD, Motel) A full day in and around Cooktown including the Botanical Gardens and the James Cook Museum. Wander the shore of the Endeavour River in the afternoon. Note: James Cook Museum entry included.

Day 5: (CB, MD, Motel) An early start through the Barrons Range to the Peninsula Development Road. Morning tea at the Split Rock Art Site, this Country contains a large and dramatic body of prehistoric rock paintings. Through Laura and Musgrave to Coen the largest inland town on The Cape. Over the Archer River to Weipa.

Day 6: (CB, PD, Motel) Weipa began as a Presbyterian Mission to the Aboriginal people of the Cape and is now the largest settlement on the Cape due to a large bauxite deposit in

the region now mined by Rio Tinto. We take an afternoon wildlife cruise exploring the Arafura Sea and Mission River. Note: Cruise included.

Day 7: (CB, PL, MD, Motel) Heading north again we visit Fruit Bat Falls for a swim at one of far north QLD's most iconic watering holes. As the northern most tip of the country gets closer the journey becomes increasingly stunning. We travel through the Heathlands Resource Reserve and cross the Jardine River on the vehicle ferry to Bamaga, settled by people from Saibai Island in Torres Strait after Saibai Island was devastated by abnormally high tides.

Day 8: (CB, MD, Motel) Today is all about reaching the Cape. We take the final slow drive through thick forest to the Northern most point of Australia named by James Cook on 21 August 1770 in honour of Prince Edward, Duke of York and Albany. We drive as far as we can but then have to walk out over the rocks to the tip. From there it is 160km to New Guinea across the Torres Strait. We return to Bamaga to celebrate reaching this iconic Australian location.

Day 9: (CB, PL, MD, Motel) From Bamaga we take the ferry to Thursday Island. TI is the administrative and commercial centre of the Torres Strait Islands set up in 1877. Since then TI has been a pearling centre and defence base during WWII. We tour the island including the WWII tunnels and emplacements. The afternoon is free before our final dinner. Note: Cruise to TI and TI Tour included.

Day 10: (CB) We take the ferry to Horn Island for a short flight to Cairns to transfer to our homebound flights.

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Day 1: (MD, Motel) Travel via Pumphreys Bridge and the Dryandra Forest to Narrogin for lunch then the Tin Horse Highway through Kulin. In the afternoon we settle into the motel in Hyden. With an afternoon visit to Wave Rock and Hippos Yawn.

Day 2: (FB, MD, Motel) Passing Dumbleyung we visit Donald Campbell's replica 1964 Bluebird K7 444km/h jet boat. Starting the Holland Way in Broomehill we discover the rich history of the John Holland Track, cut in 1893. Then we start off following the footsteps of the pioneering John Holland as we retrace the route he cut to the goldfields. You'll pass by Nyabing and Lake Grace, with its shallow salt lake and a superb lookout. Continue through rich farmland before reaching Newdegate and Hyden.

Day 3: (FB, PL, MD, Motel) Passing through the State Barrier Fence and on to the Breakaways, McDermid Rock and past Lake Johnston along the John Holland Way. Re-joining the John Holland Track, we continue on to Victoria Rocks for a stop before arriving at Coolgardie, 'The Mother of the Goldfields'. Overnight in Kalgoorlie.

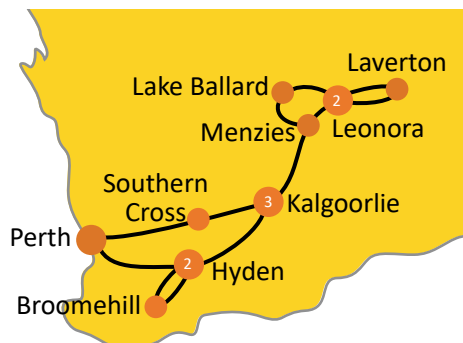
Day 4: (CB, MD, Basic Motel) We begin the Golden Quest Discovery Trail with the Ghost Town of Kununalling via Siberia and Goongarrie to Menzies. Leaving the highway, we detour to Niagara Dam and the 'Living Ghost Town' of Kookynie and the historic Grand Hotel before continuing on to Leonora.

Day 5: (CB, MD, Basic Motel) This morning we explore the restored mining town of Gwalia with the museum and historic Hoover House, built by former US President Herbert Hoover. We return to the Golden Quest Discovery Trail and pass a number of historic sites, including Mt Morgans, Hawks Nest, and John Aspinall's Grave. Arriving in Laverton, we explore The Great Beyond Explorers Hall of Fame before returning to our Leonora accommodation.

Day 6: (CB, PL, MD, Motel) We complete our trek along the Golden Quest Discovery Trail through the old gold mining towns before arriving at the 'Inside Australia' Installation at Lake Ballard, featuring 51 sculptures by renowned English Sculptor Sir Antony Gormley. We continue south to the site of Davyhurst before passing Credo Station and exploring the old station buildings. After a stop at Rowles Lagoon, an unexpected body of fresh water, we return to the sealed road and complete our circuit of the Golden Quest Discovery Trail.

Day 7: (CB, RD, Motel) Today we explore the historic streetscape of Kalgoorlie and its pioneering gold-rush history. A visit to Hannans North Tourist Mine, the WA Kalgoorlie Boulder Museum and the Superpit lookout overlooking the immense open cut mine. We wander town in the afternoon before dinner at one of Kalgoorlie's many hotels.

Day 8: (CB) Following the Golden Pipeline back to Perth. The pipe provides the essential water supply to allow the Goldfields to flourish, this ambitious feat was an engineering masterpiece with tragic outcomes. We arrive back in Perth having retraced the footsteps of John Holland, the Goldfields Pioneers and the engineers that brought life-giving water to the goldfields.

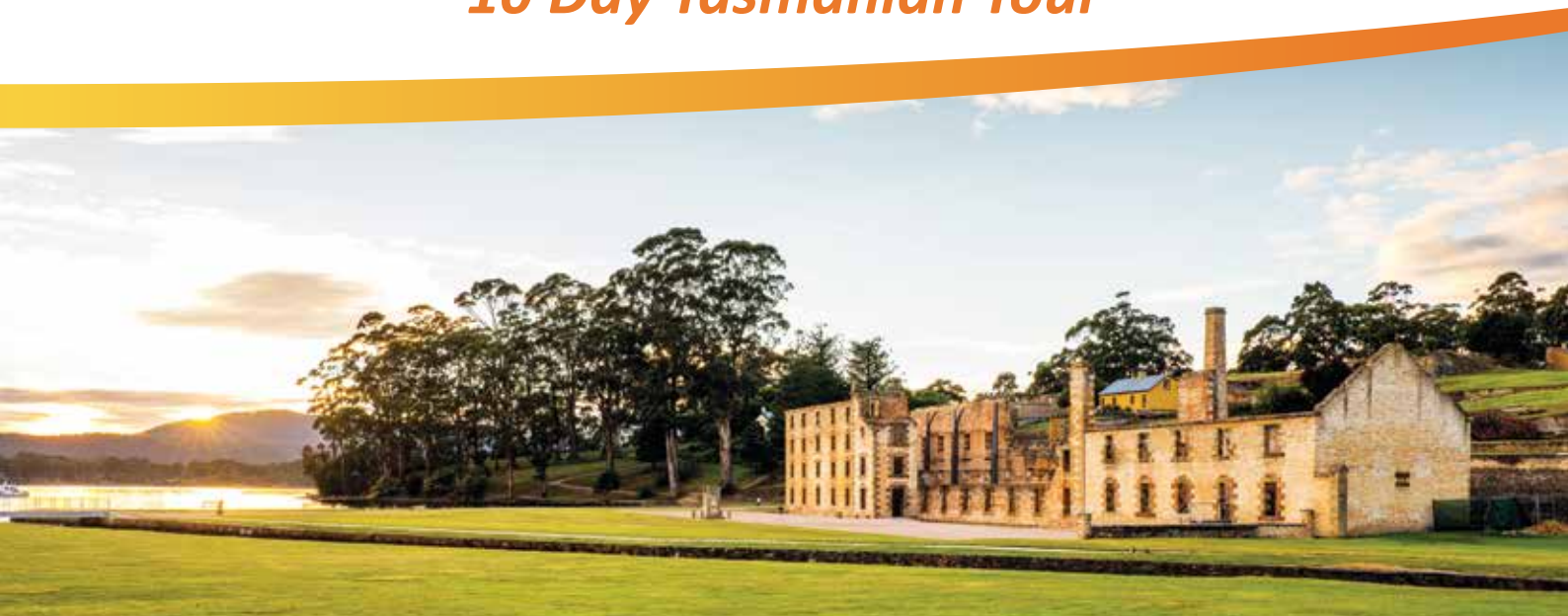

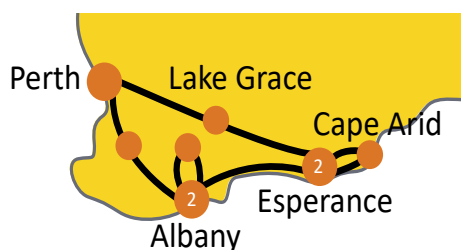

The Avon River intersects the city, bringing a natural landscape to the urban environment.

Day 9: (CB, MD, Motel) Leaving Christchurch, we travel through the rich Canterbury Plain farming area to Lake Tekapo with spectacular views across to the Southern Alps and Mount Cook. We visit the famous "Church of the Good Shepherd" and are able to take a delightful walk along the lake. Optional flight over Mount Cook available. Note: Mount Cook Flight not included. Cost approx \$450.

Day 10: (CB, MD, Motel) Leaving Lake Tekapo we follow the highland roads past the beautiful mountain lakes of the central South Island and on through the Takitimu Mountains passing Lake Wakatipu and pleasant farmlands to Te Anau on the edge of Fiordland National Park.

Day 11: (CB, MD, Motel) On to one of the Eight Natural Wonders of the World – Milford Sound. You'll travel beneath the majestic Mitre Peak towards the Tasman Sea and nudge up close to some of New Zealand's most incredible waterfalls. Day 1: (MD, Motel) After gathering our troupe of hikers we head south and up into the Darling Scarp for our first walk on the Bibbulmun Track just north of Collie (9km). Lunch in Collie before continuing to Boyup Brook and Bridgetown to settle in for three nights.

Day 2: (FB, MD, Motel) Down to Pemberton to walk in the Big Brook State Forest from Stirling Road along to Big Brook Dam for morning tea (5.5km). Back on the trail following the brook into Pemberton (6km). After lunch in Pemberton we meander back to Bridgetown stopping in on a number of farm gates and cellars.

Day 3: (FB, MD, Motel) Today we take in two of the mid sections of the trail. Down to Graphite Road west of Manjimup for a hike on the track (5.5km). We are in the upper reaches of the Donnelly River with its picturesque pools and rapids. The country around here is mostly regrowth Jarrah forest mixed in with a splattering of lifestyle lots and stone fruit orchards. In the

afternoon it is back into the forest closer to the Donnelly River Mill Village (3km). The mill was run by Bunnings from 1951 for thirty years. Now closed, the forest and the wildlife have bounced back and are thriving.

Day 4: (FB) North to Greenbushes, home of the worlds largest hard-rock lithium mine, fulfilling a third of the worlds lithium spodumene, a component of lithium-ion batteries. From north of the town we walk through the jarrah to Scenic View lookout (6km) then along pine and blue gum plantations to the Golden Valley Tree Park, finishing in Balingup (5km). After lunch our last walk is through the Bunbury Farmers Market before returning to Perth.

Day 1: (MD, Motel) Out through Brookton and Narrogin for Lunch in Wagin. Though the productive broad acre farms into the Great Southern. From Gnowangerup we skirt the Pallinup River to near its mouth in Beaufort Inlet just before Bremer Bay. Spending three nights at the Bremer Bay Resort.

Day 2: (FB, PL, MD, Motel) Boarding the three storey 23m luxury vessel to head out to the Bremer Canyon to watch Killer Whales (Orcas) in action. This ocean has an incredible natural gathering of marine life. These include sperm whales, long-finned pilot whales, and the rarer beaked whales and blue whales. Hopefully we come up close and personal with pods of striped, bottlenose dolphins leaping in and out of the water and the rare sunfish and different species of sharks, including the great whites, whaler sharks, and the stunning oceanic blue shark. We spend the whole day in the comfort of the vessel and return to Bremer Bay. Note: Cruise included.

Day 3: (FB, MD, Motel) After a big cruise yesterday we have a late start, before a relaxing day around Bremer Bay. Take in the Estuary and the mouth of the Bremer River fed by Devil Creek and Lizzie Creek. Traditional Owners have spent thousands of years caring for Country in this remote and inaccessible area, where rivers, creeks and wetlands merge into the wild marshes and estuaries that dot the coast. Lunch in town before popping over to Observation Point out at Point Henry in the afternoon.

Day 4: (FB) Leaving the coast and driving north of the Stirling Ranges to Katanning where sandalwood has been cut since the 1870s and the railway reached in 1889. Returning to Perth through the Jarrah forest and Alcoa bauxite mines of the Darling Scarp.

Please note: If the Bremer Canyon Killer Whale Expedition is unable to operate on Day 2 due to inclement weather or other reasons, we will conduct an alternative program for the day. On return we will refund you the cost of the cruise (\$400) minus alternative program costs.

Lavender flowers through December and January the fields are spectacular and the flavored produce delightful. Arriving at Karri Valley Resort on the edge of Beedelup Lake for three nights. Note: Dolphin Centre entry included.

Day 2: (FB, MD, Motel) A morning walk over to the Beedelup Falls before heading over to Pemberton to board the Tramway meandering through towering Karri and Marri forests, over trestle bridges spanning rivers and streams, along one of Australia's most majestic rail lines. 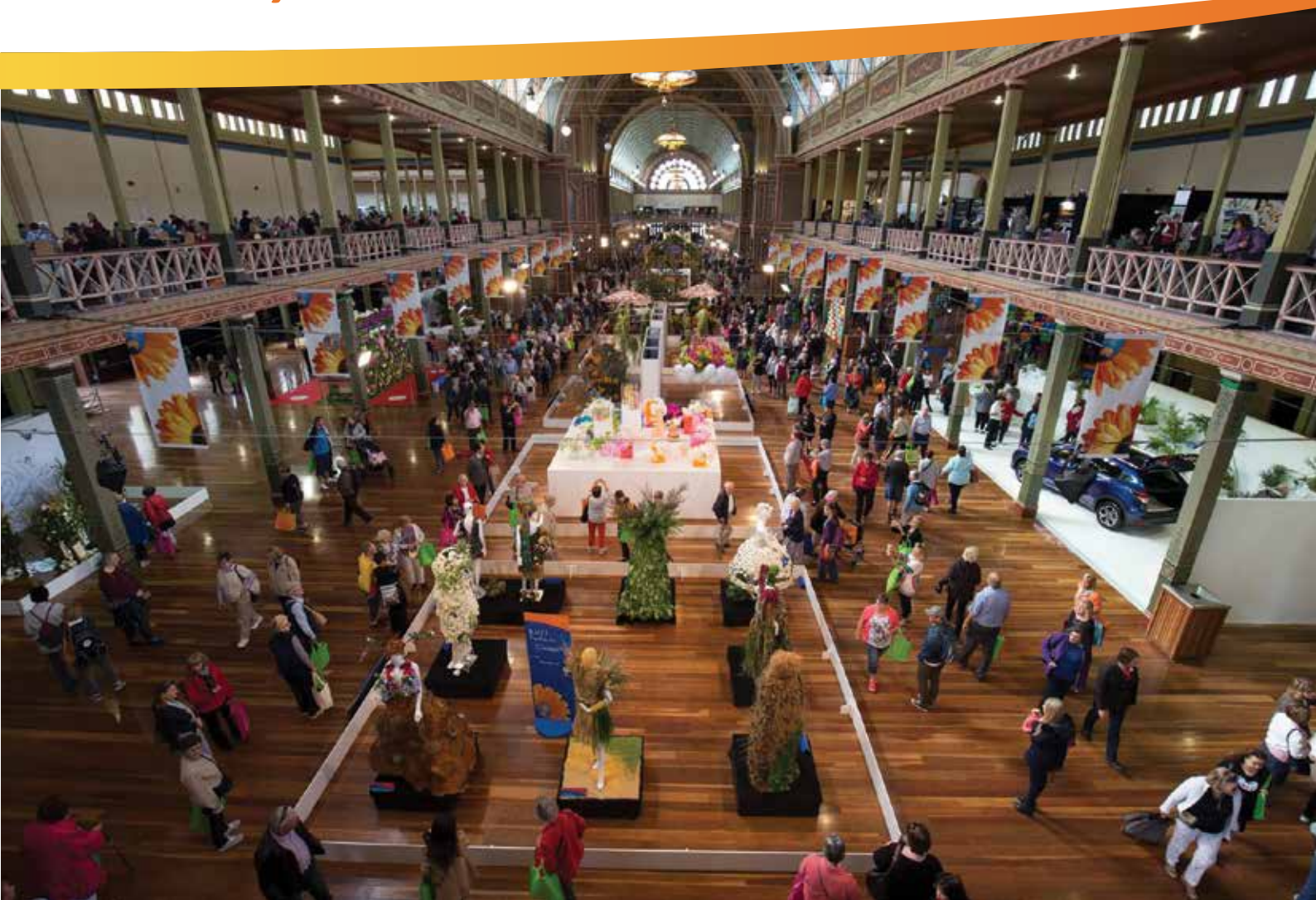

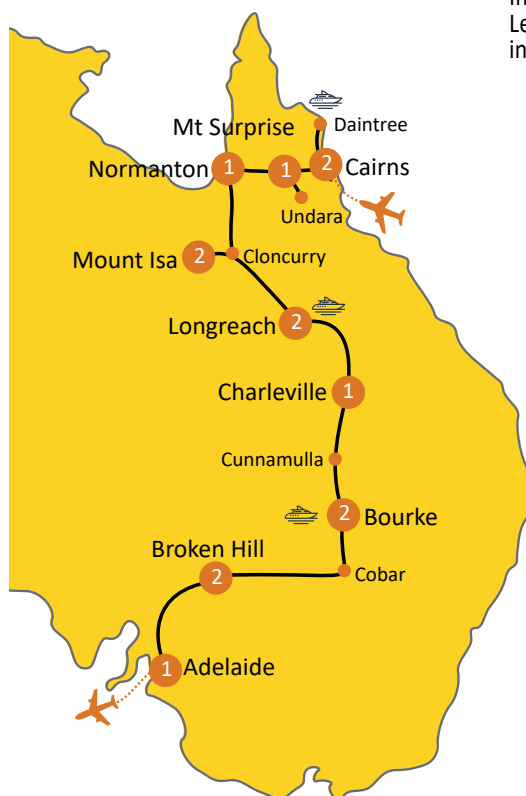

Day 9: (CB, MD, Motel) Barcaldine, the headquarters of the Great Shearers’ Strike of 1891 which resulted in the formation of the Australia Labor Party. We stop in at The Australian Workers Heritage Centre, dedicated to celebrating the lives and proud heritage of ordinary working people – telling the stories of the railway workers and blacksmiths, the farmers, nurses and teachers who shaped the nation. Then Blackall before we criss cross the Warrego River to Charleville. Note: Workers Heritage Centre included.

Day 10: (CB, RD, Motel) Charleville is an iconic Queensland location with large productive cattle stations, also home of a Flying Doctor Base and original home of Cobb & Co for the building of its coaches. Before leaving Queensland we have lunch further down the Warrego in Cunnamulla. Then south to Bourke which began in 1862 it was the last outpost of civilization before the “Never Never” thus the saying “Back of Bourke”. Bourke is a great experience with its grand sandstone buildings and history.

Day 11: (CB, RD, Motel) Bourke was a port on the Darling River for the paddle steamers and when the rail arrived the town became the largest wool rail head in the world. The new industry here is cotton production on fields irrigated from the Darling River. We visit the “Back of Bourke” Centre, an interesting interpretive centre delivering an in depth history of the region. In the afternoon we take a paddle steamer cruise down the Darling River on the PV Jandra. Note: Back of Bourke Centre and PV Jandra Cruise included, *rain dependent.

Day 12: (CB, MD, Motel) On to Cobar where copper has been mined since 1870. Along the Barrier Highway to the historic Darling River Port of Wilcannia, now only a shell of its former busy self. From here on to Broken Hill where Charles Rasp in 1883 found silver and started Australia’s leading company, BHP.

Day 13: (FB, RD, Motel) BHP now no longer has a commercial interest in Broken Hill. A whole day in Broken Hill seeing the mining industry, heritage and culture before a visit to the nearby town of Silverton where films such as “Mad Max” were shot.

Day 14: (FB, RD, Motel) Travel into South Australia on the Barrier Highway to Burra for an interesting tour of this heritage copper mining town then to Adelaide for our final night.

Day 15: (CB) A tour of Adelaide City and surrounds, with free time to explore this delightful city including the Torrens River. Later fly home.

Day 1: (MD, Motel) We fly to Adelaide, where we are met by our coach. Then a tour of Adelaide City and surrounds, later settle into the accommodation in Glenelg with free time to explore this delightful oceanfront town.

Day 2: (FB, MD, Motel) Leaving Adelaide through the wheat sheep country with the Lofty Ranges on our right. We cross the Goyder Line near Orroroo entering the northern grazing country. Stopping in Hawker before driving alongside the Flinders Ranges on our right and the vast expanse of Lake Torrens on the left. Reaching Leigh Creek, our base for two nights.

Day 3: (CB, MD, Motel) We leave the bitumen at Lyndhurst to arrive at Marree, at one time a major centre on the Ghan Railway to Alice Springs. Today is all about Lake Eyre, one of the largest lakes in Australia and also the lowest point on the continent. The Lake Eyre Basin is a very special part of Australia. It covers one sixth of the continent and holds some of the rarest, least exploited ecosystems on the planet. We enjoy a scenic flight over Lake Eyre South and the lower half of Lake Eyre North, the Belt Bay (the lowest point in Australia) and the famous Marree Man. Returning to Leigh Creek. Note: 90min Lake Eyre flight included in your fare.

Day 4: (CB, MD, Motel) A great drive through the spectacular Flinders Ranges, where some of the best outback scenery in Australia abounds. In the morning we visit Blinman then head through the ranges to Hawker to view the Wilpena Panorama; Jeff Morgan's 360 degree painting. In the afternoon we head out of the ranges via the Pichi-Richi Pass to Port Augusta, at the head of the Spencers Gulf. Note: Gallery entry included.

Day 5: (CB, MD, Motel) Heading south leaving the coast into wine country, through the Clare Valley to the Barossa Valley stopping at one of South Australia's historic and award winning wineries for a wine tasting. Returning to our Glenelg accommodation. Note: Wine tasting included.

Day 6: (FB) Into the scenic Adelaide Hills to Birdwood then onto Hahndorf. Settled by Lutheran migrants largely from Prussia, many of which were aboard the Zebra. The town is named after Captain Dirk Meinhardt Hahn, of the Zebra. German influence is very apparent in Hahndorf in the traditional 'fachwerk' architecture of the original surviving buildings. We return to Adelaide for our afternoon flight home after a fabulous tour of South Australia.

Day 1: (MD, Motel) Fly into Sydney where we are met by our coach and taken to our motel in the middle of Australia's biggest city to settle in for our first night's dinner.

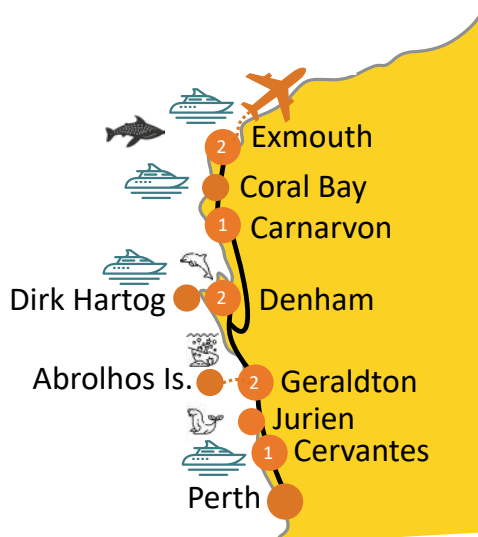

Day 1: (PL, MD, Motel) Departing Perth we get our first sights of our constant travelling companion in the West; the Indian Ocean. We explore the Pinnacle Desert before Lobster Lunch in Cervantes. In the afternoon wander along the beach at Thirsty Point before checking into the motel in Cervantes. After dinner head back into the Pinnacle Desert to view the stars and constellations twinkle in this stark landscape. Note; National Park entry included.

Day 2: (CB, MD, Motel) Out into the Jurien Bay Marine Park, home to a precious community of Australian Sea Lions, one of only 66 colonies in the world, all between Geraldton and Kangaroo Island (SA). Enjoy the frolicking sea lions from the boat or jump in to join in the playful antics. Lunch in Jurien before crossing the Irwin River through Dongara to Geraldton. Afternoon visit to the Museum of Geraldton with the best display of shipwrecks and nautical history including the Batavia, on the WA coast. Note: Sea Lion experience and Museum included.

Day 3: (CB, PL, MD) Up to Northampton before heading out to Port Gregory, settled in 1853 as a port and convict depot to cut a road and work the Geraldine Lead Mine. The port remained busy exporting lead, salt and whales until the 1920's but is now a holiday village. Stopping to view the Hutt Lagoon Pink Lake and the Lynton Convict Depot on the way back to Northampton and Geraldton.

Adventure Option;

Abrolhos Islands Flight & Snorkel - \$630 approx

Taking off from Geraldton for a 30 minute scenic flight over the 200 Islands that make up the Houtman Abrolhos Group before landing on East Wallabi Island for a guided tour of the beautiful Turtle Bay. From there, you see spectacular coral reef while snorkeling through the clear blue water. You can also embark on a nature trail walk. Returning to Geraldton over even more islands.

Day 4: (CB, MD) Leaving the Wheatbelt as we cross over the Murchison River and enter the Station Country. In this country fresh surface water is extremely scarce. As we leave the North West Coastal Highway and take on the road to Shark Bay we visit the hyper-saline waters of Hamelin Pool and Shell Beach. Reaching Denham in the Francois Peron National Park.

Day 5: (CB, MD) Over to Monkey Mia where wild dolphins have been visiting the beach for a feed for generations, then step aboard the catamaran for a cruise around nature's aquarium in search of dugongs, sponging dolphins, loggerhead or green turtles, manta rays and other amazing and endangered marine life. Return to Denham for lunch. Then down to Ocean Park, an interactive aquarium, take an educational tour with a marine scientist by your side. Watch the raw fury of sharks feeding; discover alien moray eels, highly venomous sea snakes, excruciating stonefish and more. Note: Cruise and Ocean Park included.

Experience a thrilling marine transfer from Denham to Dirk Hartog Island that offers the chance to sight dolphins, manta rays and even whales. Morning tea on arrival then embark on a journey through history as you learn about the 'Return to 1616 Nature Conservation' program. Discover the rugged beauty of the eco-island's landscape and learn about its World Heritage status. Locally sourced ocean to plate lunch, followed by a guided tour of the historical shearing shed to discover the islands pastoral history that operated for over 100 years. Soak up the sun on pristine beaches or explore further out to sea via kayak before heading back home feeling refreshed.

Day 1: (MD, Motel) Fly to Melbourne from where Burke and Wills set off on the 20th August 1860. We meet up with our party and settle into our motel.

Day 2: (FB, RD, Motel) We head into Melbourne to visit the Monument of Burke and Wills in the CBD, the Royal Society of Victoria Building and Royal Park where the party set off from. In the afternoon we head north to Bendigo. Here we view this Historic Goldmining Town which helped make Victoria the richest of the colonies. Continuing to Kerang and Swan Hill.

Day 3: (CB, RD, Motel) A morning in Swan Hill, we visit the Pioneer Settlement, wander at leisure in a bygone world experiencing real Australian history. Into New South Wales and Balranald, here on the 15th September the expedition left behind their sugar, lime juice and some of their guns and ammunition. Note: Pioneer Settlement included.

Day 4: (CB, MD, Motel) Morning paddle steamer cruise from Mildura along the Murray River and through the locks. Over to Wentworth where the Murray and Darling Rivers meet. We follow the east side of the Darling to Pooncarie then take the dirt road to Menindee and spend two nights in Broken Hill. Note: Paddle Boat Cruise included

Day 5: (FB, Motel) An interesting town tour of Broken Hill followed by a museum mine tour at Whites Gallery. There is free time to wander town or visit the historic railway museum. In the afternoon we visit Silverton and return to Broken Hill. Note: Whites Gallery Included.

Day 6: (FB, MD, Motel) Up the Silver City Highway to Depot Glen, we change explorers for a little here and look around the base camp used by Charles Sturt and a small group of men, including John McDouall Stuart as his draughtsman on Sturts 1844 attempt to find the inland sea. Continuing to Tibooburra.

Day 7: (CB, PL, MD, Motel) Through the Warri Warri Gate into Queensland to the Burke & Wills Dig Tree on the Cooper Creek, camp 65 for the expedition. It was in this area on the return journey that both Burke and Wills died leaving King alone, the sole survivor of the party. We visit Burke's Grave on the Cooper Creek and Innamincka.

Day 8: (CB, PL, MD, Motel) On to extraordinary Birdsville on the Diamantina River in south west Queensland, we visit the race track, and town. A memorable night at the famous Birdsville Hotel, a classic outback pub full of history.

Day 9: (CB, PL, MD, Motel) To Bedourie and Boulia, home of the mysterious Min Min Light phenomenon. We continue up the Channel Country to Mount Isa.

Day 10: (CB, Motel) A full day in Mt Isa, we tour the city and relax after a few days of touring. After lunch we visit Lake Moondarra just out of town.

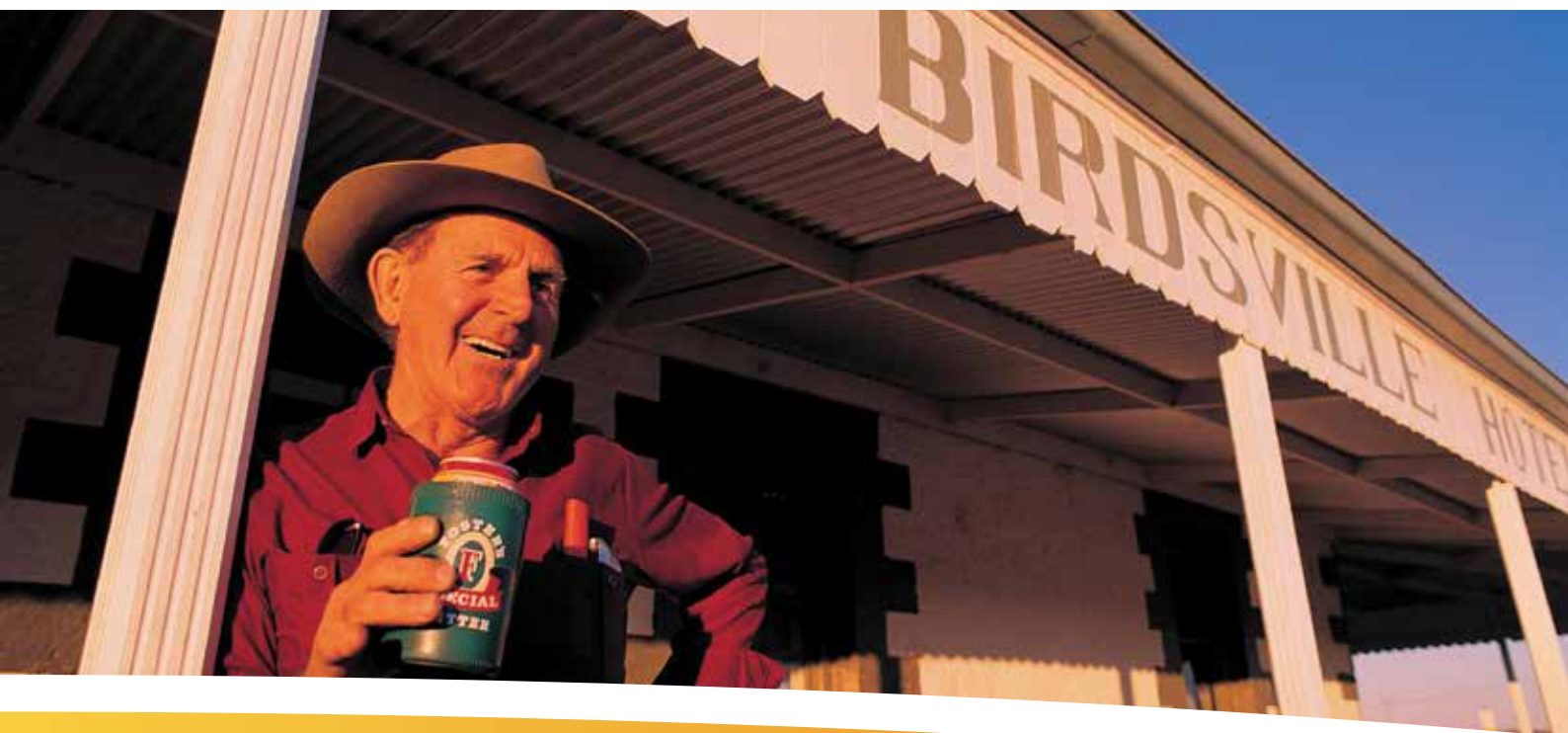
Day 11: (CB, PD, Motel) Only 400km to the Gulf of Carpentaria. This section was extremely taxing on Burke and Wills. We visit the memorial on the Barkly Highway before reaching Cloncurry. Up the road to the Burke and Wills Roadhouse which sits on another of their campsites. Visit the Cairn on the Bynoe River, Camp 119, where King and Gray waited while Burke and Wills completed the south to north crossing. Off to Karumba to get a view of the Gulf of Carpentaria with a magic sunset during dinner.

Day 12: (CB, MD, Motel) We then return to Normanton. In the afternoon we travel through Croydon and Georgetown to Mt Surprise.

Day 13: (CB, MD, Motel) The Undara Lava Tubes are amazing ancient lava flow tunnels through the earth. We tour the tunnel system before heading over the Great Dividing Range to Cairns. Note: Lava Tubes entry included.

Day 14: (CB, MD, Motel) Travel along a spectacular coastline to the lush Daintree River, where we have a boat cruise then time for lunch at the resort town of Port Douglas. We return to Cairns for a free afternoon on the esplanade, with many cafes and restaurants, galleries, markets and stalls it is a lovely coastal Queensland city. Note: Daintree cruise included.

Day 1: (MD, Motel) We fly to Adelaide, where we're warmly welcomed by our friendly crew and escorted to our luxury safari coach. From there, we enjoy a tour of Adelaide city and its surrounding areas, taking in the highlights before arriving in the coastal suburb of Glenelg. After settling into our accommodation, we take a relaxing stroll along the Esplanade, soaking in the last of the seaside atmosphere.

Day 2: (CB, RD, Motel) We travel through scenic wineries and rolling ranges to the historic copper mining town of Burra, where the entire town is classified by the National Trust. Here, we enjoy a guided tour before a relaxed lunch in a charming heritage setting. Later, we depart South Australia along the Barrier Highway, continuing our journey to Broken Hill.

Day 3: (CB, Motel) We spend a full day in Broken Hill, beginning with a guided town tour followed by time to wander and explore at our own pace. We then delve into the region's rich mining history with a visit to White's Mining Gallery, gaining insight into the industry that shaped the town. Later, we travel to the nearby historic township of Silverton, famous as the filming location for movies such as Mad Max. Note: Whites entry included.

Day 4: (CB, MD, Motel) We travel north along the Silver City Highway to Depot Glen, a site of great historical significance. In 1845, explorer Charles Sturt and his expedition camped here while searching for the elusive inland sea. Battling extreme heat and severe drought, the group remained at Depot Glen for several months, making it one of the most enduring chapters of their journey. We continue on to Tibooburra.

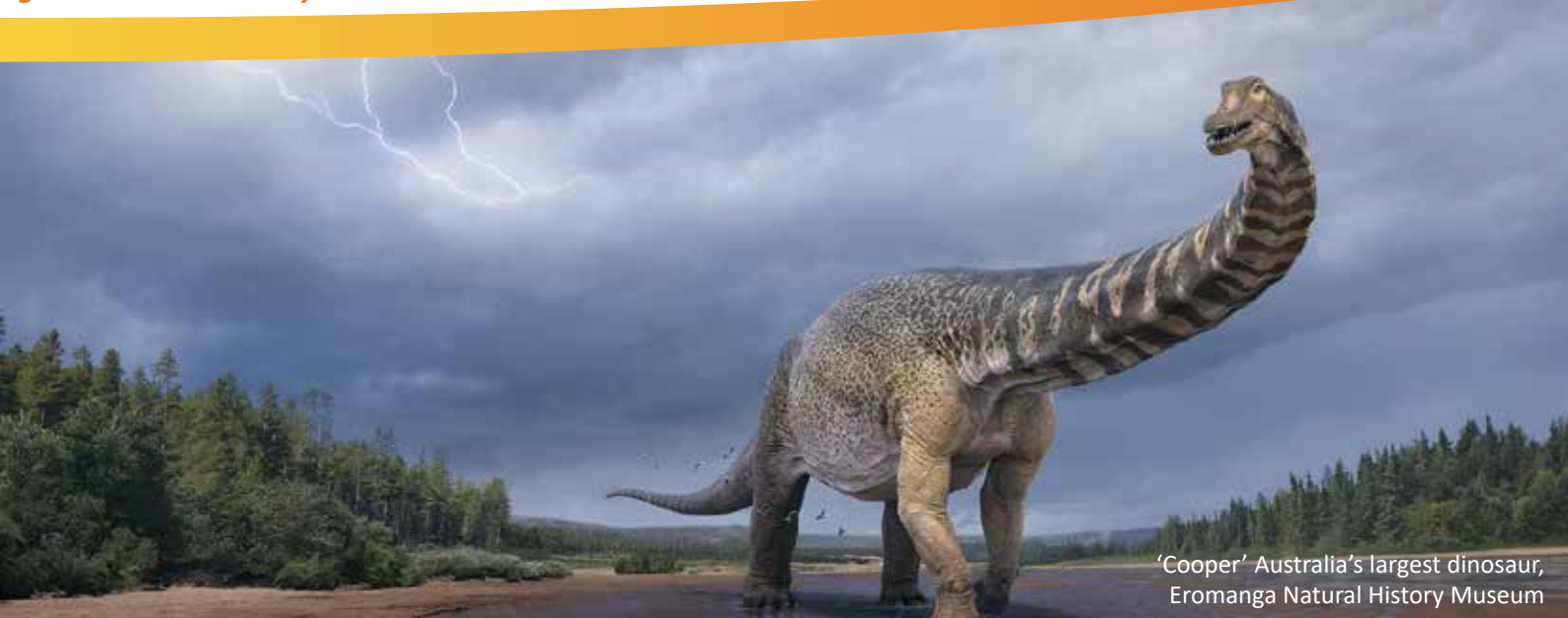
Day 5: (CB, PL, MD, Motel) We journey on to Cameron Corner, the unique point where South Australia, Queensland, and New South Wales meet. From here, we travel through the vast landscapes of Merty Merty Station before joining the iconic Strzelecki Track, named after Sir Paul Edmund de Strzelecki, the explorer who named Mount Kosciuszko. Our day concludes in the outback township of Innamincka.

Day 6: (CB, PL, MD, Motel) Just inside the Queensland Border on the banks of the Cooper Creek we reach the Burke & Wills Dig Tree. Here in 1861 the Burke & Wills expedition met its tragic end after having returned from the Gulf of Carpentaria to find the depot abandoned and thus perished. Continuing on the dirt roads to Eromanga, home to Australia's largest dinosaur fossils as well as the Eromanga Oil and Gas Basin which produces around one and a half million barrels of oil per year. We make our way to Toogunna Plains Station Farmstay, where we settle in and enjoy a two-night stay immersed in the peace and character of the outback.

Day 7: (CB, PL, MD, Motel) Following a relaxed breakfast, we tour the family grazing business and unique outback environment. Free time to explore the self-guided walks. Afternoon visit to the Eromanga Natural History Museum, to meet Australia's largest dinosaur from some 95-million years ago, watch expert guides demonstrate fossil preparation, see the incredible megafauna fossils, and witness these ancient giants come to life in a state-of-the-art multi-media presentation. Return to Toogunna Plains Farmstay to enjoy campfire stargazing.

Day 8: (CB, MD, Motel) We enjoy a rare stretch of sealed road as we travel along the Diamantina Development Road, heading back towards Cooper Creek at Windorah. Crossing the Diamantina River and continuing on to Bedourie, we take in the ever-changing outback landscapes before arriving in Birdsville, nestled in the south-west corner of Queensland.

Day 9: (CB, MD, Motel) This remote outback town, perched on the banks of the Diamantina River, holds a place in the Australian imagination as iconic as the Harbour Bridge in Sydney or Uluru in the Red Centre. Birdsville is a vibrant hub of outback history, culture, and resilience, where the vast, open landscapes meet the enduring spirit of its community. We also explore the world-famous Birdsville Track, a site steeped in tradition and excitement. Each year, it becomes the focal point for the legendary Birdsville Races, drawing thousands of visitors from across the country and beyond.

Day 10: (CB, MD, Motel) We set out along the legendary Birdsville Track, winding south through vast cattle and sheep stations and past scattered artesian bores that dot the arid landscape. Crossing Warburton Creek and the Cooper Creek, we pause at Mungerannie Station, where a permanent waterhole fed by an artesian bore from the Great Artesian Basin has created a thriving local wetland, home to over 110 bird species. Continuing along The Track through Marree to Leigh Creek.

Day 11: (CB, RD, Motel) We spend a full day in Marree, a town steeped in outback history that was once a key hub on the Ghan Railway linking South Australia to Alice Springs. In the morning, you have the option to take a scenic flight over the immense Lake Eyre, Australia's largest salt lake. From the air, you can witness the dramatic patterns of water and salt, expansive desert surrounds, and the rare beauty of this ever-changing landscape. In the afternoon, there is time to immerse yourself in the unique character of Marree. Stroll through the town to meet its friendly locals, explore historic sites, and learn about the colourful stories of the outback, from early railway pioneers to Afghan cameleers who once shaped this region. Note: Flight over Lake Eyre not included, approx \$475.

Day 12: (CB, MD, Motel) We journey south into the striking landscapes of the Flinders Ranges, one of Australia's most ancient and scenic mountain regions. Morning tea at Blinman, a historic copper mining town washed in heritage, where the stories of early miners and outback pioneers still echo through its streets. Continuing through the heart of the ranges, we are surrounded by dramatic ridges, rugged gorges, and sweeping plains. Stop in Hawker before beginning our descent following the path of the historic Pichi Richi Railway, we wind down through the spectacular landscapes that challenged early railway engineers. We reach Port Augusta, the "Crossroads of Australia," where the Flinders Ranges meet the Spencer Gulf and the vastness of South Australia's outback transitions to the coast.

Day 13: (CB, MD, Motel) We visit The Wadlata Outback Centre, a theatrical experience depicting a journey through time in the Flinders Ranges and the Outback of South Australia. Heading south to Port Pirie the destination for the lead and zinc ore from Broken Hill. Smelters have been in operation here since 1889, and it became the biggest lead smelter in the world by 1934. Our journey concludes as we travel to Adelaide, where we settle into our accommodation for our final night to relax, reflect, and soak in the memories of an unforgettable adventure. Note: Wadlata Centre included in your fare.

Day 14: (CB) We enjoy a leisurely start to the day, with some free time to explore or relax by the seaside. Later, we make our way to the airport for our return flight, bringing to a close a truly memorable tour through the heart of Australia's outback and iconic landscapes.

General Information For All Tours

1. Departure Points

- Tours with air travel depart from capital city airports, our team will meet you at the baggage collection area of the destination airport.
- Perth land based tours depart from and return to the Public Transport Centre, 116 West Pde, East Perth.
- Passengers on tours departing from Perth can board from the Novotel Perth Langley, Crn Hill St & Adelaide Tce, Perth.
- Passengers may also depart from Casey Australia Tours depot by arrangement. 16 Murphy St O'Connor (WA).
- On route pick up and drop off are available by arrangement.

2. Bookings & Payment - Bookings can be made with a \$200/\$500 per person deposit (depending on duration) by contacting us by phone, mail or email.

Full fare is payable two months prior to departure. Bookings within the full fare payable period require full payment. We accept payments by cash, cheque, bank transfer, Visa or MasterCard. (Payments by credit card over \$200 pp are not accepted unless a 1.5% of value service fee is included.)

3. Cancellation Policy - If a passenger wishes to cancel their booking, the fare will be refunded as follows;

- (a) 36 days or more prior to designated departure date 100%*
- (b) 35 to 22 days prior to designated departure date 80% *
- (c) 21 to 8 days prior to designated departure date 60% *
- (d) 7 to 1 days prior to designated departure date 0%
- (e) Day of departure or during tour 0%.

*Less monies held by any third parties for cancellation.

Third parties include but are not limited to; airlines, boat cruises, wholesalers, attractions and motels.

We recommend Travel Insurance or Fare Protection Plan as protection against this risk.

4. Fare Protection - For extended domestic tours a Fare Protection Plan is available which is designed to protect your fare should you become ill or a member of your family become life threateningly ill before or whilst on tour. Details are available when booking.

5. Pricing - All prices are in Australian Dollars (AUD). All prices are based on twin share accommodation. Single Supplements are available. Inclusions are stated at the beginning of each tour description and in the day by day itinerary.

6. Your Health - We have no age limit, we do have a fitness standard on all tours, full details are available from our office or website. We ask that if you do have a condition which may affect you while on tour to inform our staff on booking. We suggest, if you are elderly or have recently had a serious illness, to consult your doctor to see if you are fit to travel.

7. Tour Viability - We require a minimum number of passengers to guarantee a tour departure. When booking any tour we suggest making contact with our office to confirm the tour departure before booking flights or any other planned activities in connection with your tour. We will not be held liable for any fees or losses associated with the cancellation or modification of any tour.

8. Airfares - We use air services of Virgin, Qantas, AirNorth, Air New Zealand and Jetstar. Flight times are confirmed four weeks prior to departure, airline schedule changes may occur. Names as per photo ID must be provided otherwise Airline name change fees will be applicable.

9. Last Minute Bookings - Quoted costings are guaranteed up to 60 days prior to departure (subject to availability). After this time there may be surcharges on accommodation and flights. Shared accommodation may not be available in which case a single supplement will be applicable for solo travellers.

10. Alteration of Flights - If you wish to have a different departure or return flight from the scheduled flight this can be arranged for but must be stated in writing 60 days before departure. Any increase in the cost of the new flight from the scheduled flight will need to be paid. Land only bookings do not include transfers at destination or departure airport.

Types of Accommodation

On the day by day descriptions in this brochure you will find codes relating to meals and accommodation – these codes are explained below.

Motels

Generally 4 to 5 star. All rooms are ensuite. Most will have TV, Air-Con, Tea and Coffee Facilities. Rooms will be allocated on a twin share basis. Optional Single Supplement available, please see individual tour details for costing.

Cue – Mt Augustus – Warburton – Curtin Springs – Boulia

In remote areas the only accommodation available is sometimes basic. Rooms may be a simple room with ensuite, equivalent of a budget motel.

Luxury Touring Vehicles

Casey Australia Tours operate a modern fleet of Luxury Coaches and Luxury Safari Coaches with; onboard toilets, seat belts, air conditioning, tinted windows, comfortable suspension, satellite phone, PA and entertainment systems. Occasionally our tours and airport transfers may be conducted by other companies in different vehicles. Please see tour itinerary pages for specific coach details. For the enjoyment of all travellers Casey Australia Tours operates a daily seat rotation system which all travellers must participate in as a condition of booking.

L – Supplied by cafe, restaurant, hotel or similar.

PL – Picnic Lunch; meat & salad, rolls, salad packs.

Dinner

CAD – Camp Dinner; supplied by Casey Tours staff, usually includes, BBQ, or camp oven, vegetables or salads and dessert.

PD – Picnic Dinner; examples include fish & chips or a sausage sizzle.
